Modern Day Stalin-2 How Nikita Gained, Solidified Position

Beria was shot and then given a trial as an American spy. The Russian in the strict grained hooded. Things would be better. And Khrushchev climbed higher. Malenkov for Soviet farming votes and forced him to quit as premier with an explicit confession of failure. Nikita, Bulgarian, gaudy and courtly political military figure, became premier.

Khrushchev was not alone. He was a dictator in a collective leadership of the great Lenin, great struggle for world peace, glorious leader of the working class and similar titles.

It took four years of patient building of a powerful Communist party political machine to make Khrushchev a man hailed as outstanding leader of the Communist party, faithful follower and pupil of the great Lenin, great struggle for world peace, glorious leader of the working class and similar titles.

Not too long before, Khrushchev himself had pronounced words like "Communist, our beloved Stalin." This was in the presence of Khrushchev later denounced as the "cult of personality."

When Stalin's body had been safely encased in a gaudy red granite tomb fronted by a statue of Khrushchev finally was strong enough to denounce him to other Communists as a barbarian torturer and murderer, a military insect who nearly brought the nation to disaster.

Stalin's other ally? In 1954, when he was climbing toward the top of the heap under the patronage of powerful Lazar Kaganovich, Khrushchev noted: "The ideological principles of the Moscow party organization was (achieved) thanks to the skilled daily leadership I had in the person of Lazar Mosevich Kaganovich."

In 1957, after maneuvering Kaganovich out of the hierarchy, Khrushchev called him a man who "fawned and did everything to imitate the cult of the personality of Stalin." So had Khrushchev. But Khrushchev had won.

His former ally, Malenkov, became in Khrushchev's words, a "benchmarker and shadow in the hands of the dread Beria."

Khrushchev and the other top leaders may have owed their lives to an alliance with the military and the war hero, Marshal Georg K. Zhukov. In 1956, Khrushchev hailed Zhukov as a superb general who had been maligned and exiled by Stalin.

In 1957, after outwitting and exiling the marshal, Khrushchev found Zhukov had "violated Leninist principles" and pursued a "dangerous course" in objecting to Communist party interference with the armed force command. And instead of Zhukov, Khrushchev suddenly emerged as the real hero of the great World War II battle of Stalingrad. Wrote another general: "All the noble and delicate work done at Stalingrad was accomplished under the direction and with the direct participation of the members of the Military Council for Stalingrad and the Southwest Front: Nikita S. Khrushchev."

Khrushchev's men, like Stalin, could rewrite history. Khrushchev and Bulgann were sidekicks on many a hasty, hasty tour about Europe and Asia. But the time finally came when Bulgann was to be disgraced. He was forced to confess he had engaged in criminal activity with the anti-party group of Malenkov, Kaganovich and V. M. Molotov. Stalin's right hand in foreign affairs, Bulgann felt obliged to characterize Malenkov as a plotter, Molotov as an ignoramus and Kaganovich as an old windbag.


