There are only a few excep-tions: One condition known a Addison's Disease is character ized among other symptoms, by There is another condition which low blood pressure as pears off and on, known as caro-tid sinus syncope. Sudden pressure on the neck or sudden motion of the head may bring on an attack of low blood pressure together with other symp toms, but this is not the type of low blood pressure in which readers are interested. Occasionally, a person will have a drop in blood pressure wher mov-ing from a lying or sitting position equire some attention. It carries ne medical name of orthostation It is doubtful that there are any

symptoms which can be blamed on low blood pressure and noth-ing else. Occasionally people who have low blood pressure complain of lack of pep or some other vague symptom, but lack of pep can result from any number of cause and probably has no relation to low blood pressure.

Even if the blood pressure should have something to do with such complaints there is not much which can be done about it. There is no good, safe way to raise the blood pressure and it is better not to try to do it unless some condition is present which should be treated on its own As one prominent physician wrote: "The patient (with low hlood pressure) may be congrat-ulated." I might add that if all that seems wrong is a slightly lower than normal blood pressure, he doesn't need to be a pa






