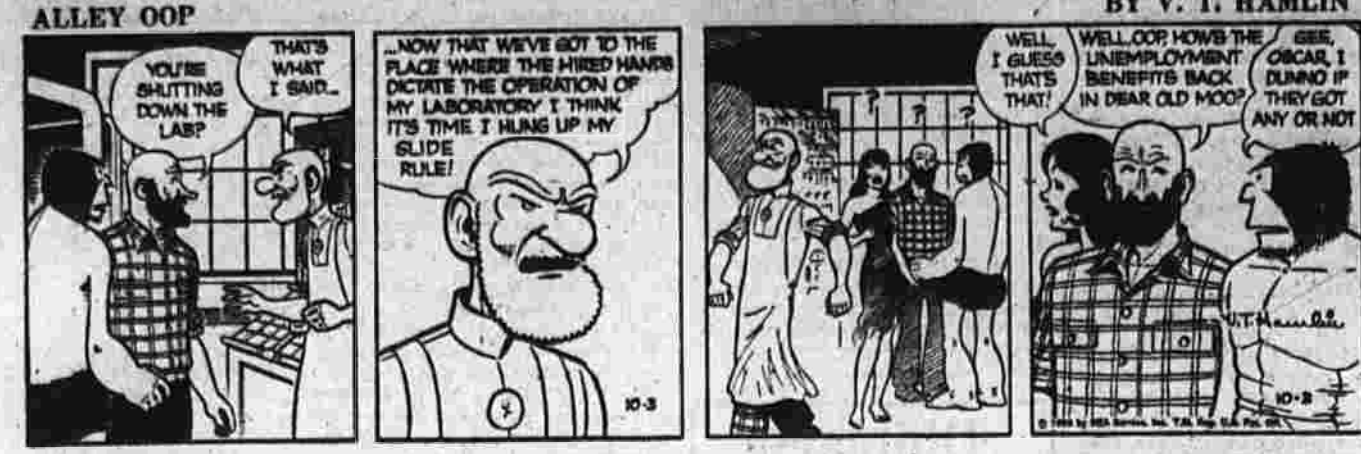

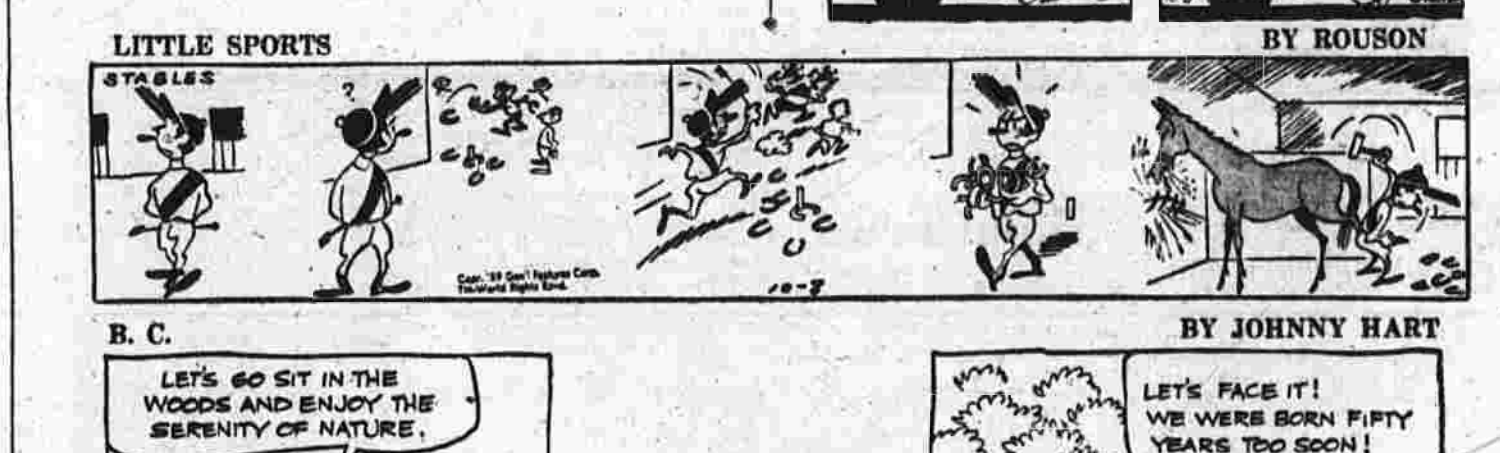

Bachelor Father Takes A Busman's Holiday

"Hi Diddle Dee Dee, An Actor's Life for Me" (from the Disney song of the same name) sang John Forsythe to your reporter over a bowl of blueberries and sour cream the other day.

The occasion for this rendition was the inquiry as to why, a fellow, who obviously doesn't need the money, leaves the luxuries of a lush California home for the heat and hard work involved in making a 2-hour dramatic show during an oppressive New York summer. The setting: A famous Second Avenue restaurant where the aroma of fresh-baked onion rolls lures actors from the NBC

rehearsal halls upstairs with a regularity that keeps directors shouting and elevators running!

Why does a man with his own weekly television series use the occasion of a precious 3-week vacation to fly to New York to rehearse and perform in a TV show as demanding as NBC's recent production of "What Makes Sammy Run?"

He does so because, according to John Forsythe, "I love it. It's stimulating. Working this show is like working in the theater. I couldn't wait to get here."

What is the background that produces such an enthused performer? Forsythe attempted to sketch it for us between interruptions from enthused autograph seekers, all amazed and delighted to see "Bachelor Father" across the crowded room.

He began his acting career at Ebbett's Field, Brooklyn, then home of the Brooklyn Dodgers. He was an announcer on the public address system.

"I loved it," he'll tell you, "I had no intentions of looking to the theater in those early days, but associating with the men in the radio broadcast booth put ideas into my head. Why not go into radio? It could mean New York radio in winter and baseball broadcasting in summer; baseball was all that really mattered to me then. So, I put together some audition material and went down to see Ted Cott at New York's municipal station, WNYC. You didn't get paid at WNYC, so it seemed a good place to begin. My audition material was "Cyrano de Bergerac" and selections from a Eugene O'Neill play. Pretty difficult material for a novice! I didn't pass the audition."

Played in Stock Companies... But a small failure like that couldn't deter young Mr. Forsythe once he had experienced that encounter with a live microphone. He became associated with a traveling stock company, playing schools and auditoriums with such productions as "Dick Whittington and His Cat." In the company were such aspiring young thespians as John Ireland, King Donovan and Ralph Clanton—all slaving and learning together. From traveling



in the road to a spot on Broadway was a natural process.

There were plays with Jose Ferrer, Edna Best and K. T. Stevens. There were radio serials such as "Our Gal Sunday," "Pettin' Flossie," "Foggy Young's Family" and "Coco Kid." There was Hollywood and "Destination Tokyo" and "Northern Pursuit."

Then there was World War II... He joined the Air Force and for a time appeared in that service's production, "Winged Victory." During the run of "Winged Victory" two important things happened to John Forsythe. He met actress Julie Warren whom he married and who developed his interest in remedial speech methods. names for little girls. Their handsome father explained the reasons for their choice, thusly:

I haven't seen her since then, but I've kept my word. When Brooke was born, she remained nameless for several weeks. We just couldn't decide what to call her. Finally, Leland Hayward, the producer of the play in which I was appearing, suggested that we take a name from one of his many lovely children! We chose Brooke."

Lead in "Teahouse" Soon after the Hayward production, there was a leading role in "Teahouse of The August Moon" with David Wayne and Paul Ford.

The Forsythes, John, Julie, Page, Brooke and son, Dall, live the comfortable life in Belair, Calif.

John works five days a week from 5:30 in the morning until late in the evenings on "Bachelor Father" (Thursday, 9 p.m.) of which he is part owner. "Work" is not only acting, but casting, producing and worrying about scripts. Weekends are spent sailing with the family and golfing. He shoots in the 80's.

From the role of Bentley Gregg, "Bachelor Father" to the recent role of Mr. Mannheim in "What Makes Sammy Run?" was easy for John Forsythe. Easy only because John Forsythe has talent, one of the major items he neglects to mention when discussing his career.

There are no child-actors in the Forsythe family. John insists that his children go through college before they determine their future careers. He was a happy normal childhood and he seeks the same for his children.
