

# **Guard After Arms Slash**

United Nations, N. Y., Oct. 14 (P)-The United States called today for a U.N. study on a system of international and domestic police forces to preserve peace in the event of total world disarmament. The new survey was proposed by U.S. Delegate Henry Cabot Lodge as a parallel to discussions of Soviet Premier Khrushchev's total disarmament plan laid before

the U.N. General Assembly Sept. 18. Lodge told the Assembly's 82-nation Political Committee the

United States would join other members of the new 10-nation Dis-armament Committee in Geneva early next year "in giving to the Soviet proposals the most serious acrutiny." He said, however, that the Unit-

ed States still does not know what kind of inspection and controls the Soviet Union will accept and this is a key to whether the Soviet plan is acceptable. "There cannot be 100 per cen
