tion of Rt. 6 in Manchester went unopposed at a public hearing in the Verplanck School last night although a few suggestions were made regarding comparatively minor changes in the route.

About a dozen of the approximately 120 residents attending the hearing asked questions from the floor or made suggestions after

hearing asked questions from the floor or made suggestions after highway department officials finished their presentation on the proposed relocation which is still at least four years away.

The State contemplates taking 32 dwellings and two resident-business type buildings in Manichester for the project. A large portion of these are in the S. Main St.-Mt. Nebo Pl. area where a master interchange is proposed.

A few residents in this area spoke at the hearings, but did not register opposition to the plan, apparently feeling the route had been fairly well decided upon.

The proposed relocation will begin at an interchange at Spencer

chosen, which would let the owners know if their properties will be in the path of, or adjacent to, the proposed highway.

Properties that will be taken by the State will first be appraised and payment made on the basis of this appraisal. However, if the owner disagrees with the appraisal, he may have it re-appraised or refer the matter to an attorney, Wilson said.

Damages based on the appraisal will be paid in a partial taking and will be paid in a partial taking and a "fair market value" will also be paid when all of a property is

Will Pay Market Value Every effort will be made by the State to pay this "fair market value." Wilson said, and the appraisal will be based on a physical inspection plus information supplied by the owner regarding im-provements, renovations, age of the property, incomes from rentals

After negotiations are completed it takes about 90 days for the papers to be passed and the money to come through, he said.

Wilson pointed out property owners will have considerable time to find a relocation since acquisition is not set until 1963. Each owner will have about six months to move after the first State contact, he said. In answer to a question from William Kusmik of 15 Mt. Nebo Pl. regarding moving a house to a new location, Wilson said arrangeements can be made to do this in

such a manner that neither the State or the property owner will lose or gain by the agreement Department Statement







Although medical science ham't yet learned to prevent or cure the common cold, your doctor can do a lot to make you more comfortable. In addition, he'll be able to handle complications without having to call in a specialist to operate on infected ears, to give just one example.

Many of the things your doctor advises would probably give your grandmother "fits," Nowadays, he'd never agree to a whopping dose of purgative as a starter. He's learned that a purge in-

dose of purgative as a starter. He's learned that a purge increases your discomfort, but doesn't blast a single virus from a stuffy nose or a scratchy throat. He'll tell you to keep your room cool and well ventilated. He's learned from his own experience that sealing the bedchamber and turning up the heat makes the nose stuffler and the throat scratchier, without suffocating your viral visitors. cating your viral visitors.

He'll urge you to get out of bed during the day, even if you have

fever, and to try sleeping in a chair at night. If you're like most chair at night. If you're like most of us you'll find you're more comfortable, up and around.

He'll advise you to eat what and when you please. He's also learned that "starving a fever" weakens the patient, not the virus. He'll assure you that red meat won't send your fever higher. And he'll warn you to go easy on fruit drinks unless you want to blow up your abdomen tight as a drum.




