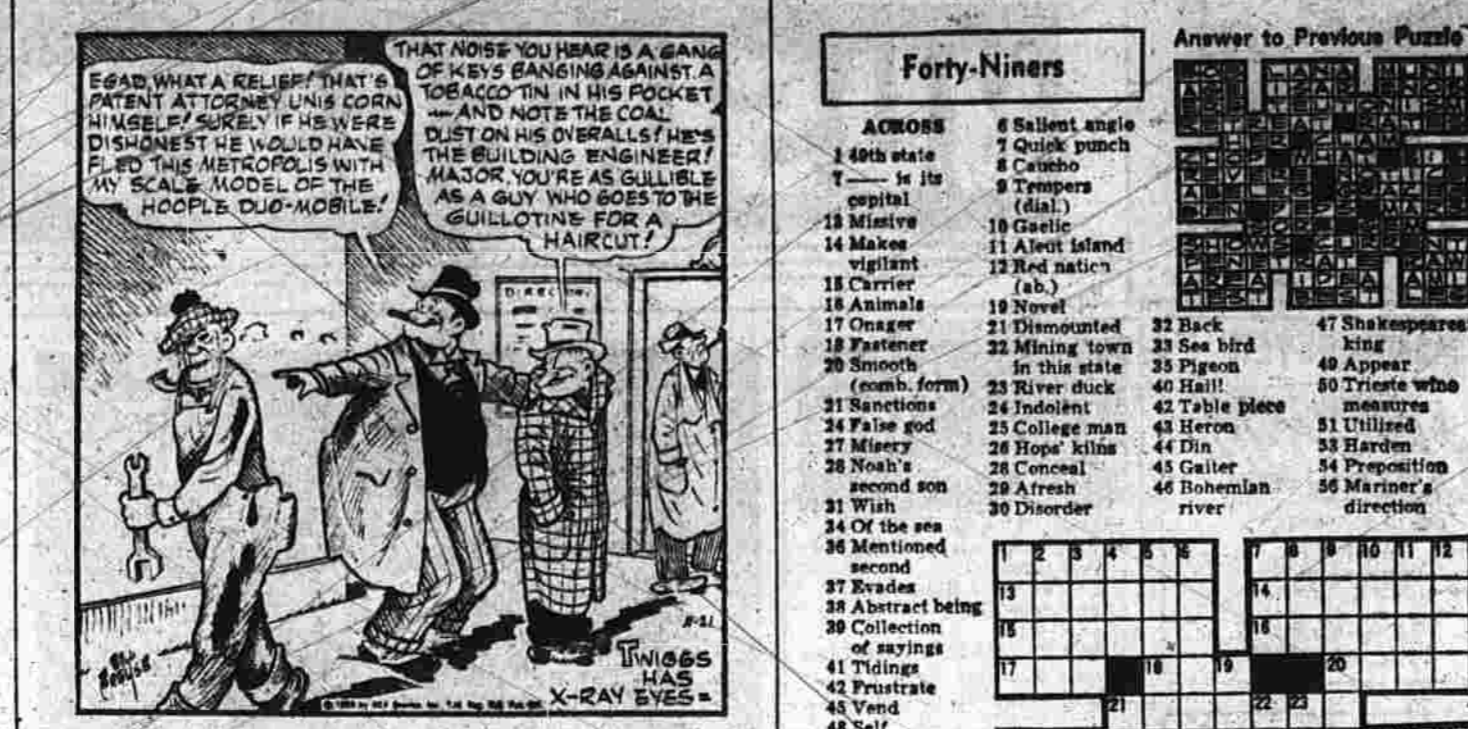

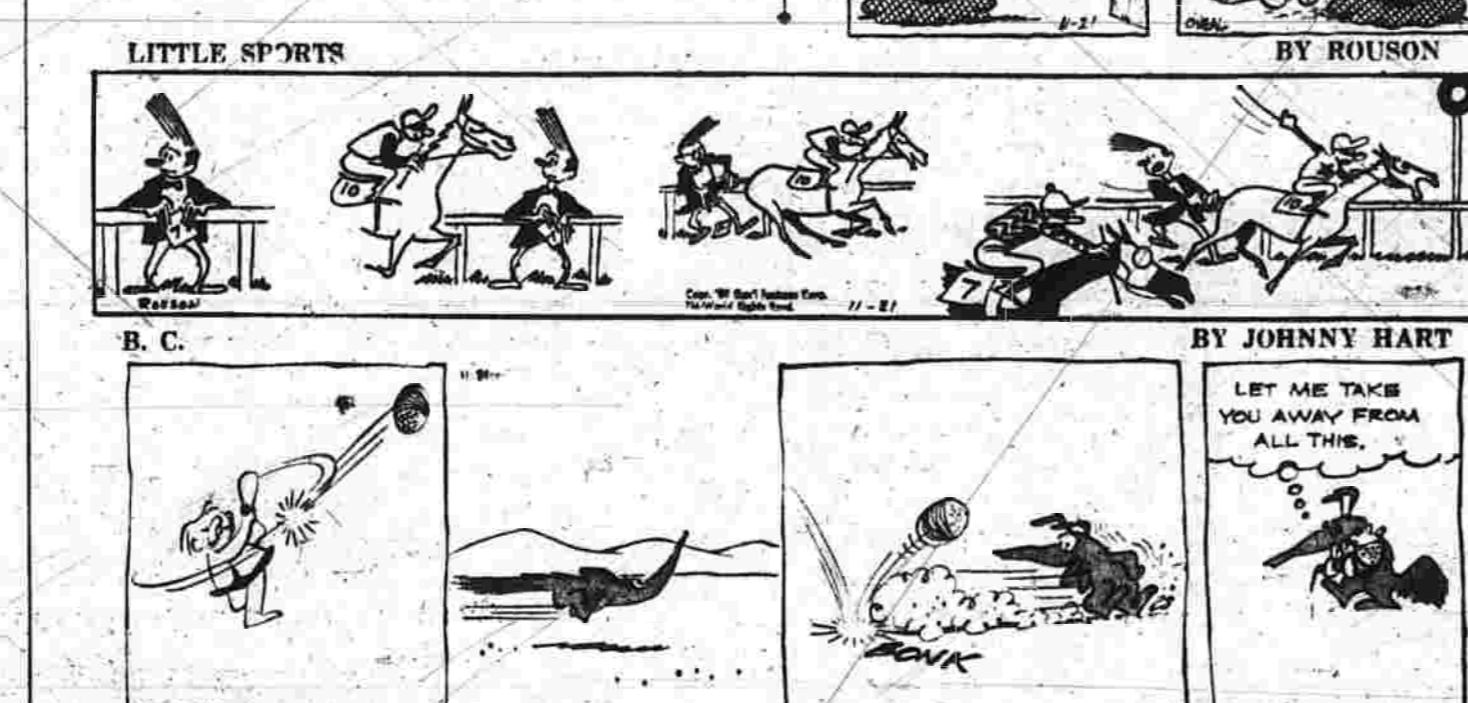

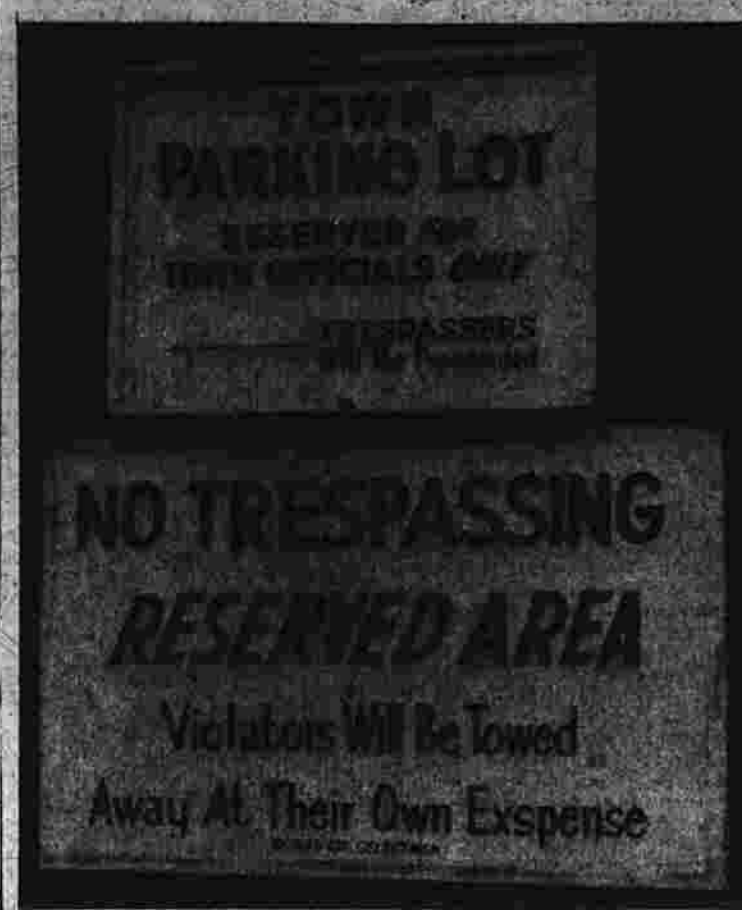

AL Auxiliary Planning Vets Christmas Shops

How do you do your Christmas shopping if you are bed-ridden? This is no problem to patients in Connecticut's three hospitals for war veterans—thanks to the ladies of the American Legion Auxiliary.

Christmas shoppers set up by auxiliary volunteers in each of the hospitals. Ambulatory patients are taken in wheel-chairs to hospital auditoriums which have been transformed into "department stores." Here the veterans make their own gift selections—ranging from lingerie and jewelry for wives and sisters, toys for their youngsters, and tobacco, fountain pens or wearing apparel for fathers and brothers in the family. Those who are bed-ridden and cannot visit the hospital Christmas shops make their selections from wagons brought to the bedside.

**Gift Wrap Items** After the veterans have finished their Christmas shopping, American Legion Auxiliary volunteers provide gift wrapping service and parcel post for out-of-State packages.

The Manchester auxiliary unit this year will provide 64 gifts in addition to children's toys as its share of the Christmas shop program, according to Mrs. Wilber Little, unit chairman of rehabilitation and child welfare for the auxiliary.

Mrs. Little is also department volunteer hospital chairman for the auxiliary. She points out that hospitalized veterans are enabled to experience the "joy of giving" to their loved ones at Christmas time as a result of the annual Poppy sale conducted each spring. All gifts for the hospital Christmas shops are provided by the auxiliary units from poppy fund proceeds.

The poppy project also permits veterans to earn Christmas money for themselves. The auxiliary pays the veterans 15 per cent for making the crepe paper poppies. Christmas shops will be opened at West Haven Veterans' Hospital Nov. 30 through Dec. 3.

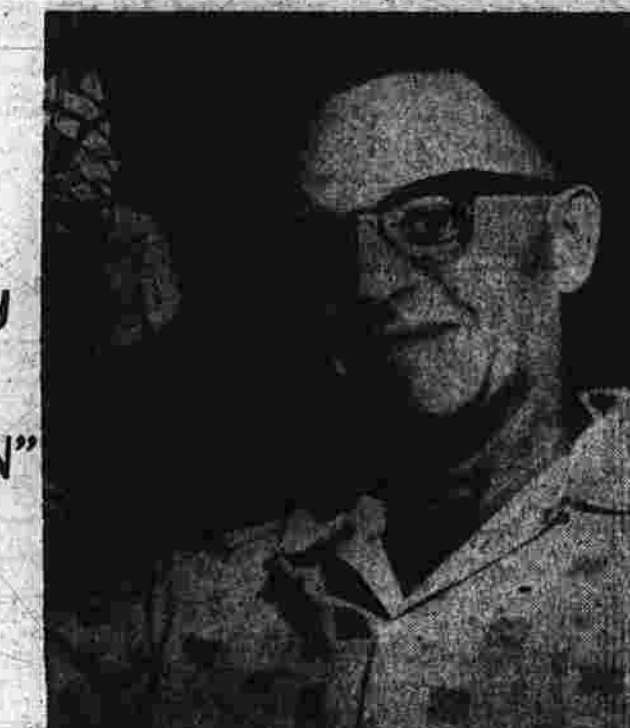

Boone Well Equipped For Role of Paladin

Now that most of the quiz programs on television are a thing of the past, try this as a replacement.

To illustrate a point and sometimes to confound an adversary, Paladin, in almost every episode that has been broadcast so far, has had at his tongue's tip a classical quotation.

Paladin takes no pains to conceal his knowledge of the classical. In one episode, for instance, a

young lady leaves his company in a huff, whereupon he notes ruefully, "Woman, I behold thee flip-pant, vain, inconstant, childish, proud and full of fancies."

In another episode, he indulges in a spree of quotations on the subject of women, quoting Lamartine, Shelley and Thackeray; the latter to the effect that "all men who avoid female society have gross tastes."

Academy Graduate
This sort of thing might seem incongruous in a western gunman but for the fact that Paladin's character makes it all seem reasonable.

Formal education, however, is not the only qualification of Richard Boone. He has been, among other things, an oil field roustabout, a fisherman, a prizefighter, an aerial gunner and a bartender.

Boone, whose proficiency in acting is attested by his nomination for two Academy of Television Arts and Sciences "Emmy" awards for his portrayal of Dr. Konrad Styrer in the Medic series, proved that he is not an actor that can be typed by his subsequent success in the entirely different role of Paladin in "Have Gun, Will Travel."

Boone's versatility stands him in good stead in his portrayal of Paladin, a mercenary champion of the Old West, who is called upon to do an astonishing variety of things in the cause of justice, from dashing across the desert on a camel to bargaining with an Armenian vintner for his daughter's dowry on behalf of a bashful Texan.

Actually, Richard Boone's present successes were attained after many years of hard work and intense training in every phase of the theater.

It was in January 1946 when he received his honorable discharge that Boone decided upon acting as a career. He enrolled at New York's Neighborhood Playhouse. After graduation, he worked in the Saratoga, N. Y. Playhouse, then played on and off Broadway in the theater and in television, racking up a score of more than 75 starring roles in television in a year and a half.

During this period he worked with Ella Kazan in the famed Actor's Studio.

in the play, "The Man," Kazan gave him a screen test which resulted in a contract with 20th Century Fox.

For 20th, he played both heroes and heavies with fine impartiality in such films as, "The Halls of Montezuma," "Call Me Mister," "The Desert Fox," "Man On A Tightrope," "The Raid," and "The Robe."

For most actors, it would be considered a large step from the intensely dedicated medico in "Medicine" to the character of Paladin in "Have Gun, Will Travel"; but, as Boone puts it, both are dedicated men. "Dr. Styrer was dedicated to the preservation of life, and Paladin to the enjoyment of life—for himself and others."

Richard Boone, the actor, is as dedicated as the two famous characters he portrays. His tireless, serious attitude throughout his years in training from the Neighborhood Playhouse through the many roles for 20th Century Fox attest to this. During the filming of "Have Gun, Will Travel," he takes an active part from the con-

struction of the sets to the actual direction.

This tireless energy carries right on into his interests at home. He has, completely done over an old house in the Pacific Palisades section of Los Angeles, even adding three completely new rooms and a swimming pool. The results he calls "conglomerate comfortable."

Here he spends many enjoyable hours with his wife, the former Claire McNoon, and their two children. He has an excellent collection of American antiques. He likes to sit for hours in a rare, old American barber's chair and read from the many books in his library.

Paladin is an educated gentleman, a West Point graduate, and a former Army officer, proficient in weapons and strategy and full of compassion and courage.

A role which only a man like Richard Boone could portray.
