

It was decided that a high data processing machine such as RAMAC 305 was most suitable. "We had to have a machine "We had to have a machine which would get any stored infor-mation at a moment's notice in any. conceivable order, execute in-structions at a high rate of speed, print extremely fast, and then punch a teletype tape," Thoreau

said. Stores 5 Million Digits RAMAC's magnetic memory can store 5 million characters or the equivalent of a million words. Any characters can be extracted from the machine's memory in two to six tenths of a second. The processing unit can function at the rate of 30 steps per second. Addi-tionally, RAMAC can print at a

The great little gladiator who won the featherweight, lightweight and junior welter-weight titles was found dead yesterday in a \$21 a week midtown hotel room. Medical authorities said the 51-year old scrapper apparently had died of natural causes two days ago. When Canzoneri failed to show for two days at the

show for two days at the Broadway restaurant which paid him for the use of his name, a friend, checked the hotel. The popular, jaunty ex-champion was found lying across a bed, clad in his under wear. The word quickly spread up and down Broadway, into the hangouts of the boxing clan, the haunts of the theatrica

people and over to Eighth Avenue where Tony staged some of his greatest fights at Madison Square Garden. In front of the restaurant where Tony held court each night for those who remembered back to the exciting days in the 1920s and early

many of his friends clustered. They talked in almost hushed tones of the man with the big smile who won 140 fights, lost 24 and drew in 11 and then, after his re-tirement in 1939, joined comedian Joey Adams in a successful night club act. Purses were not always big his days but he earned

He knocked out Singer in the first round Nov. 14, 1930 for the lightweight championship lost it to Barney Ross 214 years later and won it back with a victory over Ambera after Ross moved up to the welterweight division. It wasn't so long ago that Tony recalled for the umpteenth time his first fight with McLarnin in the Garden. 




