Filming on location, wherever it may be, invariably presents prob-lems which are never encountered lems which are hever encountered in the comfortable surroundings of a studio. Since most of the scenes of "Staccato," NBC-TV, are filmed on the streets, subways, restaurants and jazz clubs of New York, these production problems are multi-olical plied.

Always a perfectionist, John Cas-Always a partectionist, John Cla-mavetes, who stars in "Staccato" and is part owner of the show, takes a close hand in the direction. Personally, I pre-fer location work because I think the realism gives the program a good dramatic impact."


