President Favors Hiking Pay Floor

Washington, Feb. 19 (AP)—The administration apparently has agreed to go along with a modest increase in minimum wages. The move could mean fatter pay checks for well over a million workers.

Secretary of Labor James P. Mitchell sent Congress a report yesterday saying a modest increase in the present dollar-an-hour minimum wage is now feasible without curtailing employment or earning power in low wage industries.

There were indications the administration may recommend an increase to \$1.10 or \$1.15. The administration also is expected to repeat recommendations to extend the law's coverage to about three million workers now exempt from minimum wage and overtime provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act.

Democratic Congressional leaders have been pushing for a higher minimum wage and more extensive coverage. Organized labor and a Senate Labor Subcommittee favor a \$1.25 minimum and inclusion of seven to 10 million non-exempt workers.

Mitchell is expected to make specific recommendations for increases when he appears before a House Labor subcommittee March 2.

About 24 million workers in interstate commerce are covered by the present law, but for hours worked beyond 40 a week, the requirement for time and one-half overtime pay for hours worked beyond 40 a week, is still exempt are about 20 million workers—mostly in the retail trade, domestic service and agricultural classifications.

Mitchell said an increase to \$1.10 would give more pay to about 1,800,000 of the 24 million workers now covered. An increase to \$1.15 would mean more pay for about 2,400,000 workers, an increase to \$1.20 for three million workers and to \$1.25 for 3,600,000 workers.
