Van Rie Denies He Fought with Cruise Friend

anything you observed about her appearance? Defense Atty. W. Langdon Powers asked.
"She looked strange, sick," Van Rie replied.
"Van Rie, 31, said Miss Kauffman was a normally lively and gay person, but she did not seem so that day.
"Did Miss Kauffman then leave the lounge?
"A. Yes.
"Where did she go?
"A. I don't know, sir.
"From the moment she left the lounge that morning and passed out of your sight did you ever see her again?
"A. No, sir.
The blue-eyed man said he talked to Lynn again about noon. He said her porthole was open and he asked how she was feeling. She said she needed anything, but that nothing further was said.
He denied he and Miss Kauffman had ever quarreled.
"Van Rie said the girl failed to come to lunch or dinner that day, which was unusual. He said he had his evening meal at about 6 o'clock.
Prior to dinner, he said he had played with the children in the lounge and prepared the tables and forms for receiving a weather report.
Although he tuned in, he said he didn't get that particular weather report and returned to the lounge after taking a shower.
Van Rie said he told Miss Kauffman in the night of Sept. 17 when the U-2 was in Halifax. "Lynn you are funny dressed. You are giving me naughty ideas."
The girl was wearing a white cotton coat that came about to the end of her shorts, he said.
The state previously had made much of this statement as indicative of the romantic alliance between the two during the long voyage.
"Van Rie wore the same dark suit he has had on since the trial started Feb. 10. He rested his elbows on the arms of the witness chair and clasped his hands occasionally before him on the edge of the witness box.

Rockville-Vernon Selectmen Appoint Five Men To Recreation Commission

Five persons were appointed to the newly authorized Vernon Recreation Commission last night by the selectmen.
Named were: City Alderman John Gill, Republican, and Sylvester McIntosh, Democrat, both of Rockville; Stanley Bates, Republican, and Andrew P. Tricardo, Democrat, and Atty. Frank J. McCoy, unaffiliated, all of the Vernon Fire District.
Composition of the committee as to political affiliation and residence was stipulated when organization of the commission was authorized at a Town Meeting Feb. 2.
The commissioners will elect their own chairman, and will serve until Oct. 15, 1961.
Gill headed the Rockville Recreation administration of the city government, and is a member of the board, Bates is secretary of the Zoning Commission and is district supervisor of the Connecticut River. Tricardo was appointed foreman of the town highway department, in January following municipal examinations. Atty. McCoy was president of the Rockville Little League last year and has been a coach for five years. McIntosh, a heating engineer at Pratt and Whitney, had not been active in local affairs.

of Cuba. The crowd on the walk, hotel and Eisenhower smiles.

The following students had been seen at the route: "Understanding You, Submission Yours." Another sign had in small letters "We Love You and in large letters "Eisenhower."

But virtually everyone else in Rio seemed ardently pro-Eisenhower. Thousands of small red, white and blue bards rained down from the 20th-story buildings, along the tree-lined Avenida Rio Grande.

The parade route started at the Naval Ministry and ended at the U.S. embassy residence where Eisenhower had arranged a luncheon.

At the Navy Ministry he received a formal welcome to Rio. He came aboard the presidential plane of 180 million citizens of the United States. Eisenhower said in his welcoming, "I hope that my brief visit here will emphasize the desire of my government and all the people of my country to strengthen the bonds of friendship with you."

That desire, Eisenhower said, is based on a selfish element.

"A mutual conviction that all the problems existing between us can be resolved to the benefit of both nations and a lasting partnership is essential to build a stronger, freer world."

Crowds began pouring into the gaily decorated streets hours before the arrival of Eisenhower. Jamming traffic along main business streets in every direction. The Brazilian police, wearing black-and-white uniforms, took their positions along Avenida Rio Grande.

wealthy doctor says the gun went off accidentally as he tried to throw it away after wrestling it from his wife. She was shot in the back.

The family maid, Miss Marie Anne Lidholm, 19, interrupted the scuffle in the Finch garage. She was a star state witness.

Craig told the jury of five men and seven women that Finch shot his fleeing wife, then returned to the garage, hunting Miss Lidholm. She ran into into the home to call police.

"She has Mrs. Finch to thank for that escape," Craig said. "If Mrs. Finch hadn't run, what do you think would have happened?"

Craig scolded the pattern to the cloth, "Weaving his story around the story told by Marie Anne without disputing her."

But he pointed out 18 ways he said her stories differed. He told the jury:

"You've got to decide whether you're going to believe this man," he pointed at Finch. "or this woman who pointed at 'Carole' or Marie Anne Lidholm. Income Tax Facts—3 Many Things Count As Taxable Income

(This is one in a series of articles on federal income tax filing. These articles are based on information provided by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the Connecticut Society of Certified Public Accountants in cooperation with the Internal Revenue Service.)

All kinds of income may be taxable — your salary, dividends on stock (check the instruction booklet for special treatment of these), interest on bonds or savings, event prizes you win can be a tax headache. For example, a television contest had won a \$3,000 outboard motor boat which would cost him about \$900 in income tax, and a beautiful set of luggage (another \$30 tax dollars). Then the prize was a whole year's supply of chicken feed. Everybody laughed, including the contestant, and his tax bill diminished another \$25.

The value of a prize is considered part of your income even if you made only the slightest effort to win it. Reaching into your pocket for a quarter to buy a raffle ticket is sufficient effort, as is signing your name to a free entry blank.

The fair market value of the commodity you win is the amount you consider income. If you are a \$10,000 a year and win a prize worth \$2,000 then your total income for the year, for tax purposes, is \$12,000.




