8th District Directors Oppose Consolidation

The board of directors of the 8th District today declined to meet with a Chamber of Commerce committee to discuss consolidation of the district and the town, adding that it is opposed to consolidation.

The statement came in response to a series of questions asked by a request by Dr. Charles E. Jacobson Jr., chairman of the Chamber of Commerce's local affairs committee, for discussion of the issues of consolidation.

The directors replied to Dr. Jacobson in a 3-page letter and said they felt a meeting between district and Chamber would be "of no consequence and unnecessary."

The most unfavorable aspect of consolidation, the directors suggested, is the "tremendous investment" required by the town to bring about the joining of the two municipalities.

"The one thing that consolidation might make possible," the directors said, "would be to increase the town's borrowing capacity through the acquisition of additional assets. As town capacity, it is debatable whether or not this is desirable."

Also, the directors said they felt one of the "prime requisites for consolidation is the purchase of the Manchester Water Co. It is conceivable that this would require an expenditure neighboring \$1 million. The town would still be spending a great deal more money to improve the quality of the water and to maintain present to man the installation."

The directors said the privately-owned water company is in the process of improving its water supply.

"Certain," they said, "consolidation could do no more."

District President David J. Marks said this morning that the district officials have taken a careful look at the consolidation picture in the weeks since Republican Town Committee Chairman John F. Shea Jr. described consolidation as the coming key election issue.

Shea spoke to Republicans at a GOP Lincoln Day dinner Feb. 12 and said consolidating town and district fire and sewer services is the only way to encourage industrial development and ease the tax burden on homeowners.

Shea also said the town must be prepared to take over the Manchester Water Co. If the firm cannot supply adequate and good water to North End customers, the town's statements, together with the requests of Dr. Jacobson and his committee, have earned critical interest in the issue among district residents, Marks said.

The directors first point to the consolidation of the district and the town, adding that it is opposed to consolidation.
