The two men were shot when they ran outside to investigate after a crude fire bomb hit a window last night. Police said the boy was arrested at a downtown hotel in the pre-dawn hours. Circuit Solicitor Charles Wright identified the boy as Jerry

Earl Hunt, a high school student in the neighboring town of Attalla, Ala. Wright said the boy, a slim blond with a crew cut, was held on charges of assault with intent to murder.
