School Band Plays Well, Crowd Rude

The Manchester High School Band was heard last evening in its annual concert. A near capacity crowd was on hand to hear the youngsters in a varied program that included numbers as early as Handel and as late as Leroy Anderson.

The band played well, period. You notice I didn't say they played well for a high school band; just the band played well. And I mean it. Once in a while, it's true, they were a little green around the gills, but on the other hand, more than once they were truly impressive. The average was very good, even for bands of college caliber.

Consequently I was considerably miffed that the audience did not appreciate their efforts. Throughout the evening there was a low but continual buzz of conversation throughout the numbers. The implication was obvious: "It's only the High School Band. We don't have to pay much attention to them."

I changed my seat, in hopes that it was only one section, but found the same thing on the other side of the hall, and I inquired from three other people. The result was that out of five samplings, there were four reported noisy sections.

This attitude on the part of the audience is unpardonable. Those youngsters were working just as intently as any highly paid concert artist. If the guilty ones had been only high school students (and many of them were) the rudeness might have been overlooked to some extent. But when one mother details all the symptoms and treatment of her daughter's case of measles to another woman during a performance of

music from Bizet's "Pearl Fishers." I get mad. I would have told her to shut up, but the gossip was so general, it would not have made much difference.

Getting back to the concert, the whole thing was highly successful. In addition to the band members, there was some very entertaining baton twirling by the Majorettes under the captaincy of Patricia Little, who designed the routines.

Roberta Johns was featured in the solo part to the first movement of a flute concerto by Mozart, and did a bang-up job of it as well. She was accompanied by Pamela Parker at the piano, who provided excellent support to the soloist.

As another example of the audience's rudeness, I might cite the fact that these two youngsters got no applause on their entrance; the audience was too busy talking among themselves to notice they had arrived. Consequently the poor kids had to start cold, before they must have felt was a hostile house.

Altogether I congratulate the musicians, and in particular Mr. Vater under whose baton they performed. And I cry, "A pox on audiences of this type" in best stenographer and Shakespearean tones.

Hollywood —(NEA)—It's no longer the "Madonna Reed Show," you know.
And the Donna who lost the "Ma" couldn't be happier.
It was one of those things that happen in television and which need time to be ironed out. Even after winning an Oscar for her role of the sexy tramp in "From Here to Eternity," Donna Reed was typed by TV as the "perfect mother."
The sponsor who bought the "Donna Reed Show" set down the rules:
"No fights, no arguments, and she can't even lose her temper."
After one season of Donna

playing the wife of a pediatrician and mother of two children in a small midwestern town, the critics choried that "no mother can be this perfect."

That's when someone made the "Madonna Reed" crack.
And that's when Donna says the show decided to "flex a whole new set of muscles" with a new approach to the domestic life of Dr. and Mrs. Stone in the mythical little town of Hilldale.
Here's how Donna tells about it:

"I was criticized for underplaying everything but it really wasn't underplaying. There wasn't anything there to play. It was sort of like the way things happen in real life. People think of a mother-wife as 'just a housewife.'"

"Now our scripts take the approach that instead of just being a housewife I'm a mistress of the menage, a princess of the pantry, a maharajah of the mop."

"I'm everything now," she laughed, "plus being a glamour girl at night."

The scripts for the show were given a change of pace — "gentle humor" alternating with "ramrod" punch lines. Phil Sharpe, who once worked as a writer on Phil Silvers' "Sergeant Bilko" show, was brought in this year to help take the "Ma" out of Donna. That he has done by giving her more and more comedy lines and sharper dialog.

"It's really amusing," Donna told me. "I've been acting ever since my four children were born (off-screen she's the wife of Producer Tony Owen) and now for the first time when we all sit down to dinner, the kids, I think, wait for me to be funny."

"I was never allowed to do comedy in motion pictures and I'm having a ball. I still laugh every time I think about what Pam, my 13-year-old daughter, said when we left the house to go shopping one day. As we were going out the driveway in the car she said:

"Now, mother, don't forget to goof off. I think my kids now think of me as sort of a feminine Milton Berle."

No, Donna doesn't try to kid herself about being the feminine

counterpart of Robert Young on TV.

"Don't tell anyone I said this," she whispered, "but when the chips are down on our show Father knows best, too."

"The Donna Reed Show" has one of those controversial laugh tracks, recorded in a studio projection room when a small audience views the complete half hour, but Donna says she keeps her fingers crossed every week.

Not exactly sold herself on pre-recorded laughter for TV, she says: "Every time our studio audience misses a laugh line, I say to myself: 'Wonderful! Maybe the audience at home will fool 'em and laugh. And you know something—I've watched the show in the homes of friends and they do.'"
