So I'll pay for this space. Before and since then I have been making in my limited way a study not only of tax dolars but, of more importance to me personally, r federal, state and corporate dollars. I said on March 30 that one corporation in which I am interested

nother corporation which helps eek out a livelihood for me in 1959 ith a lesser amount of business volume than in 1958 increased its net rnings 15.9 per cent while still another with again lesser volume inreased its net earnings 7.4 per cent.

Although I have an investment in the Rogers Corporation I do no have at my finger-tips the exact figures but I do know that Saul Silverstein, a fellow-townsman and president of that company, has most definitely increased the worth of my stock and my dividends. None of these companies cut salaries or wages but instead adjusted

both upward in ratio to the increased cost of living. From a very big and most successful executive I have a letter very recent date, from which I quote because it hits the nail on the ead in either public or private business. I doubt that we have a top man in our employ who could not inase our overhead over night and with very little mental effort. "Conversely, few of our top men in their respective divisions give nuch thought to reducing production and distribution and inventory tosts when business is booming and, in fact, most of them actually esist suggestions that when times are good is the time to think of hat inevitable rainy day."
"Actually, it is not very difficult to trim down costs when times are good because everyone from top to bottom is in a pretty good frame

"We are sure we will step up sales again in 1960 and we are likevise sure we will reduce operating costs in 1960."
"What we are not sure of and I challenge any student of economic istory and trends to back a rosy prediction for 1961 with his bankroll." "I have never been accused to being a pessimist and I do not go along low with those who are making dire predictions for 1961." "But, my associates in this company are determined to get our ship into the best shape possible to weather any storm which crosses our path and if it crosses the horizon of business in general we will all What has all of the above to do with our federal, state and town tax dollars? This viewpoint is limited to Manchester. Town officials, all town officials can spend. Some spend themselves into debt.

Not tomorrow but today, our town officials together with the best business advice available should dig into the overall question: "Where are we going?"

May I stress that I am gunning for no official. I criticize no official, completely mindful of the fact that most of our big public expenditures have been forced by pressure groups. And I would not take any office at any salary.

Taxwise, unimportant is the present clamor for weekly collections of trash. As separate matters such items as more swimming pools, greater recreation facilities, expansions unheard of a few years ago in our school curriculum and many, many other items, none of which of themselves are costly but collectively they keep sending the tax rate.

themselves are costly but collectively they keep sending the tax rate higher and higher and they force high and higher evaluations of all saxable property and new bond issues.

Sure, they are progress and, sure, I admit that I like nice things. But, a few years ago, as time flies, when the Cheneys built our public schools, our gas company, our electric light company, our fire-houses, our water system, our sanitary sewage system, gave the land for many of our churches, gave us parks, gave us libraries, gave us swimming pools; many saw the world through rose colored glasses. Many times I was called a "fool" for opposing Cheney-owned schools, at \$1 a year rent. The one time I suffered a smashing town meeting deteat was when I strenuously opposed letting Cheney's build our

Well, those Cheneys are gone. Here as all over the country there will never be the charitable, philanthropic and oft-times paternal blessings of yester-year because present-day taxes will never again allow the individual or corporate accumulations which built universities, colleges, hospitals, Rockefeller Centers, provided the billions needed for medical and thousands of other research programs.

No, I'm not against progress. But when Henry Ford started his then heralded objective of a "Car in every family" and stepped it up to two three cars in every family that was the day. Another so far ignored phase of shifting governmental costs which looms up like a smallpox plague of a few years back is the wire-pulling to get the federal government to build so-called cross-country highways and the wire-pulling of towns to get the state to take over more and more roads as trunk-line highways. First, where does anyone think the federal government gets its funds?

Admittedly, Connecticut gets back but a very small percentage of the amount it pays into the federal treasury but Little Connecticut will never have the necessary power in Washington, nor will all New England, to change that grossly unfair situation.
