Dr. Carteton is executive vice president of the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions, He had directed the far-flung activities of the American Board, overseas agency of the Congregational Christian Churches, since 1954 when he returned to the United States from the Near East after 30 years as a leading educator in Turkey and Syria.
