The radio shift is proposed because the Police Department must change to a split channel system by July-31 to meet FCC rules.

The present 12 radios could be changed for \$50 each, but the town would also have to spend \$360 each for 12 new alternators and \$1,000 for a new antenna.

The new radios, transistorized, would save the cost of alternators, according to Police Mechanic John Baldyga.







Khrushchev's speech cast gloom over summit conference opening in 11 days. He issued an unveiled threat to United States Allies, took a hefty slap-at Vice President Richard M. Nixon, and charged that President Elenhower's freedom of movement at the summit is being a tricted by "certain U.S. circles."

Khrushchev referred angrily to President Eisenhower's suggestion that Nixon might sit in for him at the summit
