clear testing into the disease, He was merely testing a monkey wrench into it. Last week, a nice display of coming around to our position, the Russians at Geneva suddenly agreed with our point that, in view of doubt whether underground nuclear tests should be detected, there should be a program of research undertaken, research which would in itself involve some underground explosions, in order to perfect means of detecting this type of explosion. The Russians also agreed that the scientists and the scientists should get together and agree on how to conduct such a research program, and the Russians said that they wanted such research to be a joint affair. Such a meeting of scientists is still supposed to be held.

It was at this point, between Russian acceptance of the principle involved and joint discussion of how the program should be carried out, that President Eisenhower made his announcement, which was to the effect that we ourselves would carry out such a program independently. This was not, as so much of the world assumed, an announcement that we were rejecting underground tests of a military nature. But it was a policy stand at the Russians, designed, no doubt, to show that two can play the game of rocking the summit to the summit. Other news of the day made this particular demonstration a little superfluous.

The Button Not Pushed Perhaps the most dramatic way to look at the plan incident is to look to enter the mind of the American pilot involved, as he found himself in trouble far inside Russia. The fact that he himself hasn't yet had an opportunity to tell us what he thought and what he did hasn't halted some of us from letting our own imaginations do the job for him. Hanson Baldwin, military expert of the New York Times, for instance, wrote quite a piece in which he pictured the pilot facing his "moment of truth," at that moment, according to the game we were playing, it was his duty to destroy himself and his plane. That the plane was equipped for this is assumed by the commentator and expert. As he faced his moment of truth, our pilot had to know what was expected of him. He was expected to sacrifice himself, so that the game being played could go on. He was supposed to push the button which meant death.

That was under the code of the game being played, the only honorable thing to do. It was undoubtedly following this code that he was selected for such an assignment in the first place. Let us make notation, at this point, of the possibility that our pilot, as he faced his moment of truth, decided to live, even though that might involve the reputation of not having played the game to his best advantage. In such a case, it could and will be argued that, as the servant of a nation, he had no right to make such a personal choice. Still, we can take his moment of truth as a symbol of the moment of truth in making itself, or choosing, to live. We do talk of the moment when we are supposed to press it and preserve the rules of the game by destroying ourselves. Perhaps, in that moment of truth, we too shall have some instinct to give the code one final evaluation, and then choose life. If we could make that such a general decision that it amounted to a changing of the code, we might even succeed in defining the choice of life as sensible and noble and courageous rather than as a possible failure of fortitude.

You Should Know... John Hutchinson

Town Director John Hutchinson is a strong-willed man. He believes in individualism — the greatest gift of the United States. "We can't afford to lose it," he says. "We shouldn't let it slip through our fingers. We should fight to the end for it. We don't cancel out — we fight."

The 38-year-old treasurer and general manager of the Hamilton Standard Federal Credit Union is easily the most controversial local figure in town. He has been called a "maverick" by Republicans and Democrats alike. One fellow Democratic Director has termed him "the worst town manager I have ever seen."

He says his efforts have really benefited the town by improving efficiency in the government and making the Board more informed. He says his efforts have been hurt by "that anti-union" feeling which has been hurtling feelings wasn't his intention. "It's agreed that Hutchinson is a hard worker with special interest in the town's financial affairs. From his time, he rarely misses a meeting and he has been a member of the Board since 1952."

As a boy, he was an election day runner for the Democratic party in Hartford's old first ward, and one of his children in a radical Democratic family. (The family lived on Manchester's Chestnut St. before moving to Hartford.) John's father was a Cheney Bros. foreman.

He graduated from Bulkeley High in 1939 into a world of jobs including sales, advertising and dance instructing. At 18 he hitchhiked to California to work for the United Aircraft Corporation as a machine operator at Pratt & Whitney in East Hartford. He was married the following year to the former Alice D. Knight of Oweego, N. Y., who was an executive of the Southern New England Telephone Co. at the time in Hartford.

The couple now lives at 113 Helaine Rd. with sons John Jr., 17, Lawrence, 14 and William, 12. Mrs. Hutchinson, also an active Democrat, is the party's treasurer, town clerk, town committee member and president of the Manchester Federation of Democratic Women. Hutchinson's Army career, he

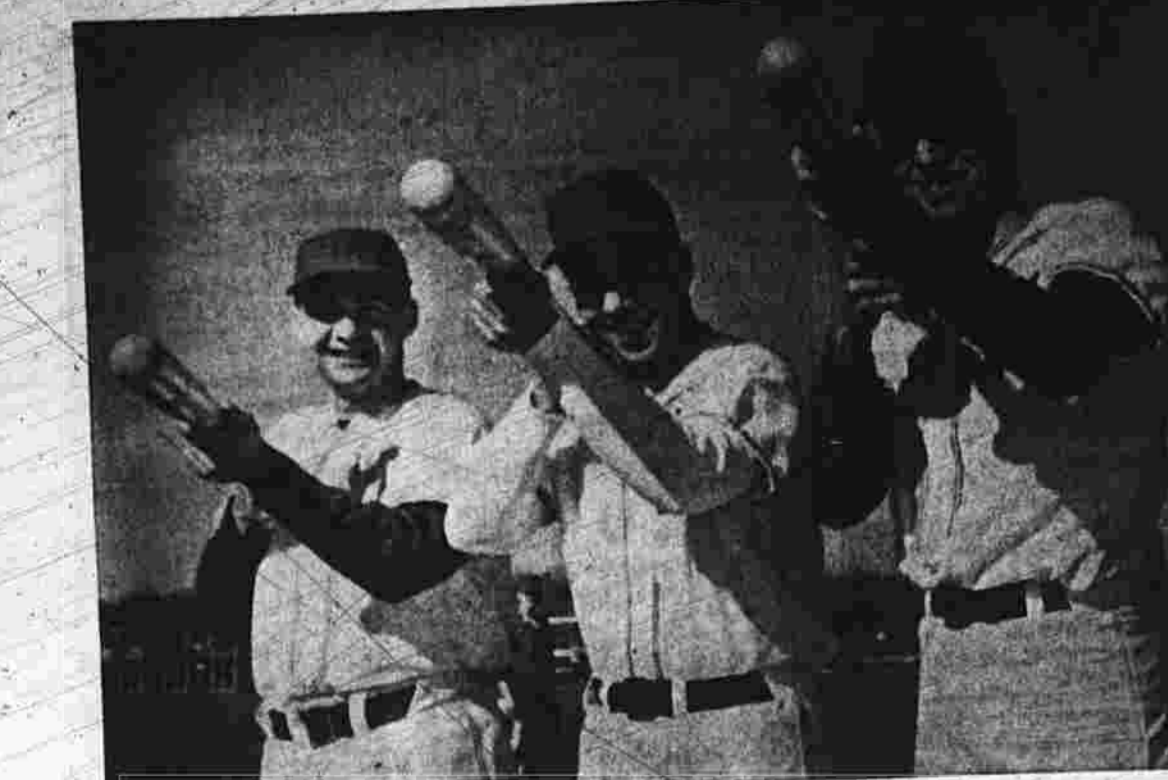

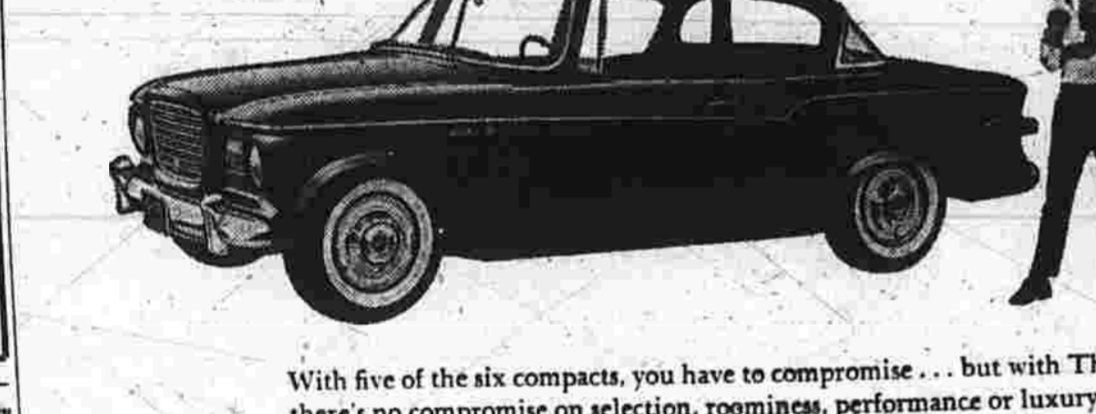
