

Eisenhower said the Soviet "fetist of secrecy and concealment" is a major cause of international tension and uneasiness, and forces the United States to engage in "below the surface" activities to gain information to protect the free

The BOCA code was adopted in Connecticut in 1951 to replace a State Building Code approved by the Legislature in 1949. The earlier code was felt to be impractical, Rutherford said.

Immediately after the meeting, First Selectman Richard N. Galinat said action will be started to bring the code before a town meeting for adoption.

Arthur N. Ruthford, a consultant on building codes with the State Public Works Department, outlined the code and answered questions about it.

Local Option

In answer to a question, Rutherford said a community may make any changes it desires when it adopts the code, but, he noted, very few changes have been made by the various communities.

Answering another question, he said, local ordinances should govern whether or not a community wishes to license builders, plumbers and electricians.

We don't recommend this, since we feel it is up to the community to decide how it wants to han-

lined the code and answered questions about it.
Rutherford recommended adoption of the code which spells out in detail the area of buildings and minimum specifications in the construction of all types of buildings.
The biggest cost of adopting a code, Rutherford said would be its administration, and enforcement. In order to enforce such a code, the town would need either a full time or part time building inspector, and or part time building inspector, and he, naturally, must be paid, code.

"I believe this problem could be solved," he said, "by setting fees for building permits high enough to pay for running the department."
