(D-ark) of the Foreign Relations committee said that "the President's decision not to make any more trips is a sound one."

But Sen. John Sparkman (D-Ala.) while welcoming more emphasis on established diplomatic channels, commented that "we must admire the President's willingness to make another trip if he felt it would do any good."

Sen. Everett M. Dirksen of Illinois, the Senate Republican leader, called Eisenhower's speech "an adequate answer" to critics of the latest trip, and Sen. Alexander Wiley (R-Wis.) said the speech was "very good—its expression of the American viewpoint."

From Sen. Lyndon B. Johnson of Texas, the Senate Democratic leader, came the comment that "I hope and pray that he is right regarding the beneficial effects, and I also hope they outweigh whatever losses he may have sustained."

Eisenhower accused the Soviet and Chinese Red leaders of being engaged in a "deliberate attempt to split the free world, causing friction between allies and friends."

"We must not fall into this trap," he asserted. "All of us must remain firm and steadfast in our united dedication to freedom, and to peace with no less a goal."

Meanwhile, he said the United States has made it clear that "all real progress toward mutual disarmament would be achieved, our first concern would be to keep our defenses strong, modern and alert."

"We cannot win our fight against the Communist purpose to dominate the world by being timid, passive, or apologetic when we are acting in our own and the free world's interest. We must accept the risks of bold actions with coolness and courage."

Secretary of State Christian A. Herter already has said that Eisenhower plans no further good-will missions during the remainder of his term.

Eisenhower himself admitted last night that "I have no plans for any particular trip in mind."

He also said that considering the short period until he leaves office in January and the unavoidable preoccupations of the few months remaining, it would be difficult for him to accept any new invitations to go abroad.

But then, as if replying to those who have criticized his personal missions and particularly the failure of his Japanese plan, he said: "So long as the threat of Communist domination may hang over the free world, I believe that my future presidents will conclude that reciprocal visits by heads of friendly governments have great value in promoting free world solidarity."

"And this I assure, if any unforeseen situations or circumstances arise, that I am frequently convinced that such reciprocal visits are of such positive value to the free world as to obstruct friendly governments have great value in promoting free world solidarity."

Eisenhower said that as a result of his Far Eastern trip "the relations with the Philippines, Taiwan, Korea and Okinawa have been strengthened. He visited all those places as well as the new states of Alaska and Hawaii."

He referred briefly in his speech to the Soviet action yesterday in walking out of the 10-nation disarmament conference at Geneva.

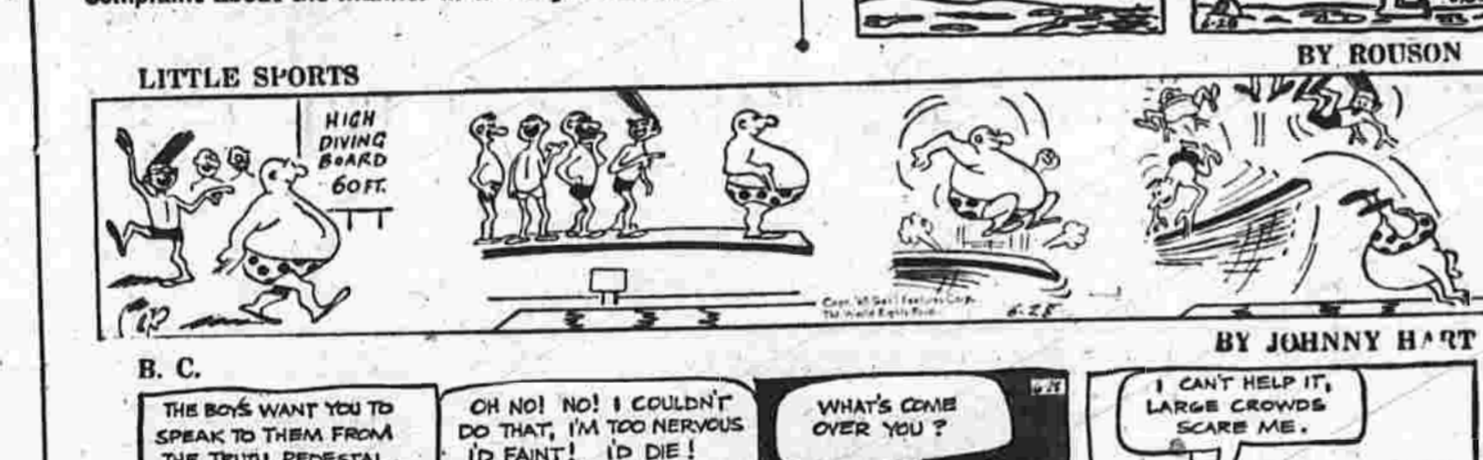
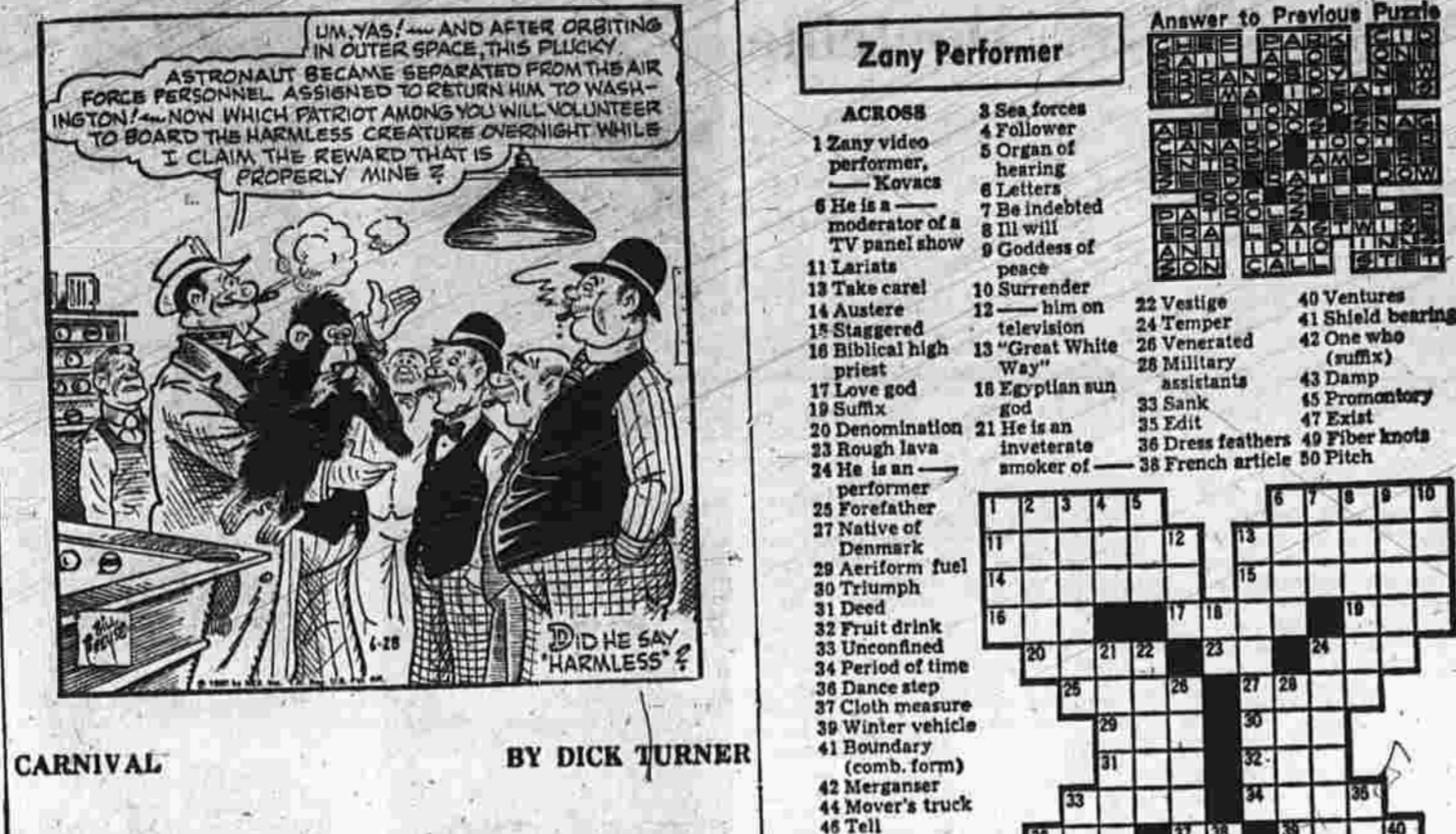
