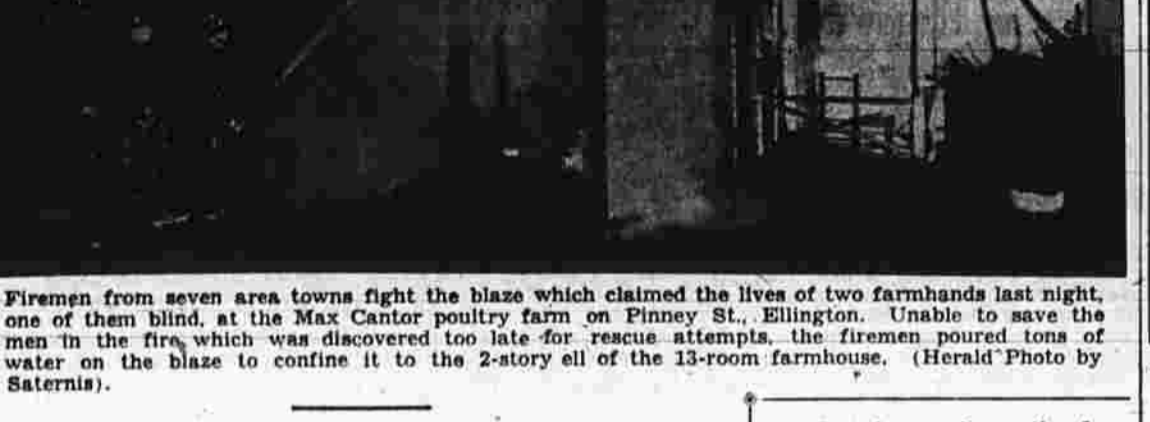

Rockville Vernon School Budget Request Hits \$1,339,458 for 10 Months

The Board of Education has submitted a budget for 1960-61 totaling \$1,339,458 for a full year or \$1,339,458 for a 10-month period.
The 10-month budget was figured at the request of the Board of Finance which is studying all town budgets preparatory to a shift to the Uniform Fiscal Year adopted in town meeting last month. Figured on a 10-month basis, the school board's budget has increased \$10,071 over last year's 12-month budget.
Major increases are reflected in teachers' salaries and pupil transportation costs. Salaries have increased \$84,250 from \$72,724 to \$88,074. Normal increments are \$4,250 for each teacher.
Pupil transportation costs were increased \$4,212 to \$74,212. This year there will be 18,125 pupils transported. Last year there were 17,900 pupils transported. "Powers testified that for fulfilling the espionage assignments of the American intelligence service he received previously basic pay of \$2,500, as compared with the \$750 he received previously while serving in the U.S. Air Force."
Washington, Aug. 9 (AP)—The father of U2 pilot Francis Gary Powers says he has been given a 10- to 15-day confinement in solitary confinement in a U.S. prison, he said today. He said he was hearing for Moscow, where the son faces trial Aug. 17 on espionage charges.
But Russia's No. 2, Khrushchev, said he was not sure of the possibility that the pilot was brainwashed.
"Powers has not been influenced in any way for the trial, but methods as using lie-detectors and brainwashing techniques are being used to get legal details," L. N. Smirnov told newsmen in London last night. Smirnov said.

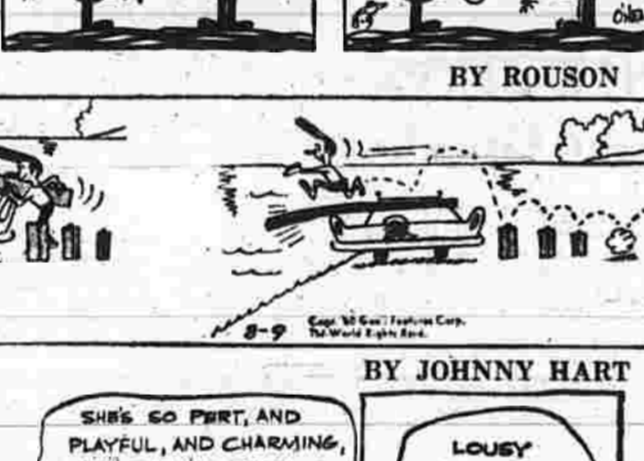

In some instances, Miss Lanford said, a middle-aged rat, 400 days old would live almost as long as the young animal to which he was joined. The fur, eyes and gen-

eral appearance of the older animals took on a younger appearance as a result of the surgical union. Miss Lanford said researchers don't know yet just what it is that the younger animals transfer to the older ones. The technique is being continued as a tool for the study of aging.

The two projects were reported in papers yesterday before the fifth International Congress of Gerontology, Gerontology is the study of aging processes. The work with the sharp dietary restriction was done by Dr. Henry S. Simms, pathologist of the Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons. It might well apply to overweight humans as well as to rats, he said. And it produced convincing evidence, Simms added, that reduced eating can delay the onset of disease as well as delay death once disease has taken its foothold.
