The four other passes, two hours apart during the night, will be visible wherever the skies are clear over most of the

Sphere to Be Visible

On 5 Passes Tonight

Cape Canaveral, Fla., Aug. 12 (P)-The United States sent giant communications satellite into orbit high above the Earth today and quickly signaled its success by bouncing a message from President Eisenhower across the nation. The new space messenger, a balloon high as a 10-story building, was rocketed up from this missile test center at 4:39

A little over two hours later the National Aeronautics and Space Administration announced it was successfully in orbit. Then at 9:10 a.m. EDT, less than four hours after launch, the recorded message from the President was played back at a news conference in Washington.

The message came back loud and clear when received at Holmdel, N. J., after being sent from Goldstone, Calif.

Pension Plan Assets Stand At \$653,886

The Manchester pension plan had 853,886 in assets as of last June 30, according to an annual report from James Arthur, chairman of the Town Pension Board. Over the 1959-50 fiscal year, which ended June 30, \$41,553 was paid out in pensions, Arthur said.
There are 46 pensioners.

Over the same period, the 245 active members of the plan contributed \$27,695, the town government kicked in \$50,000, and interest arned from investments am to \$17,200 he said. Plan members pay 21/2 per cent their salaries and the town 19-

propriates yearly amounts.

The investments are in U.S. reasury securities and U.S. Sav-Arthur also noted that the Hart-ford National Bank was hired as investment advisor last winter and fown Directors voted to make pension plan memberahip compulsory for all town employes hired after March 1959. The bank will act as advisor in a more liberal invest-ment program the Directors also approved last year.

Laboratories here held a 2-way talk with a colleague in Goldstone, Calif., for a few brief moments at 5:18 a.m. EDT. The radio signals earrying their voices bounced off the Echo I satellite some 1,000 miles in Space. the Echo I satellite some 1,000 miles in Space.

But at Dallas, Tex., the Alpha Corp., announced its engineers had talked more than two hours earlier with engineers of the Collins Radio Corp. at Cedar Rapids, Iowa, also using the satellite.

The Bell Labs telephone hookup "wasn't much of a conversation," a spokesman said Live voices were carried both ways. The feat came just two hours after Bell scientists successfully held the first 2-way communication with recordings.
