Mrs. McGarragh Accepted For Special Science Study

Mrs. Bertha McGarragh of the elementary school staff will be going to school six days a week next year. This is one of only 30 elementary school personnel who have been accepted for an institute in science to be conducted at St. Joseph College, West Hartford.

The institute is sponsored under a grant from the National Science Foundation, which is the only one of its kind in the New England states. It is one of 15 experimental programs in science for elementary school teachers, supervisors and principals in the country.

The plan of the institute is based on a conviction that the greatest benefit of science in the primary grades is to be obtained through observation and broadening of observational experience. Superintendent of Schools George E. Graf said in reporting Mrs. McGarragh's acceptance at the institute.

In order to carry out this type of program successfully in the elementary school, it is essential that teachers understand what they want children to observe, why these experiences will be important to their study of science, and how to make direct observations.

The objectives of the institute are to add to the strength of participants' scientific knowledge of fundamental concepts of science and to provide opportunity to try out experiments and make observations with the kind of materials and apparatus easily obtained and used in the ordinary classroom.

At the institute, Mrs. McGarragh holds a bachelor's degree from St. Joseph College and a master's degree from the University of Connecticut. She is in her 17th year of teaching in the Bolton school.

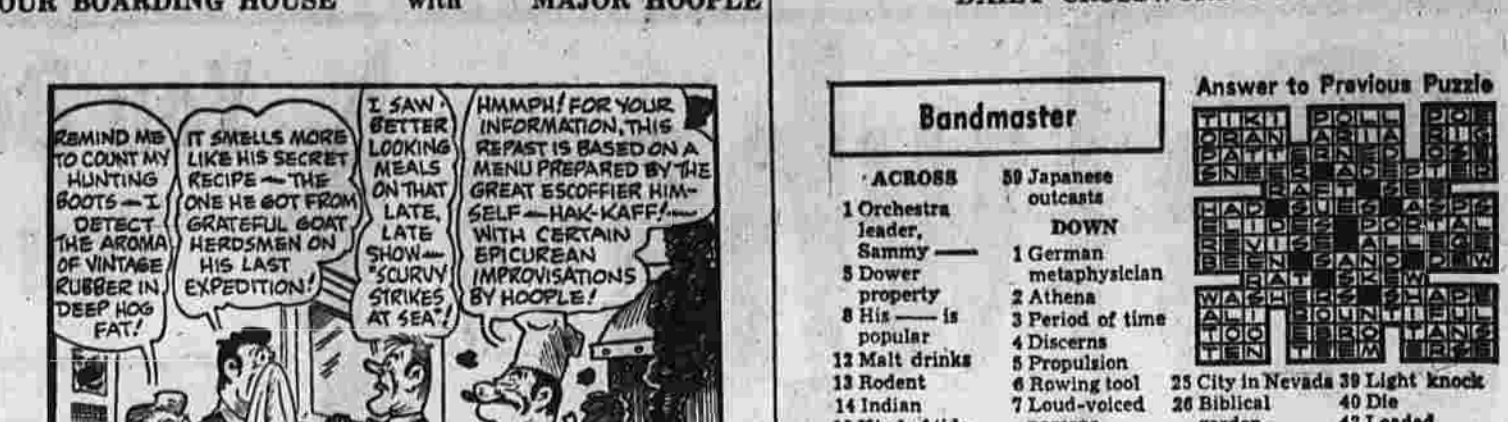

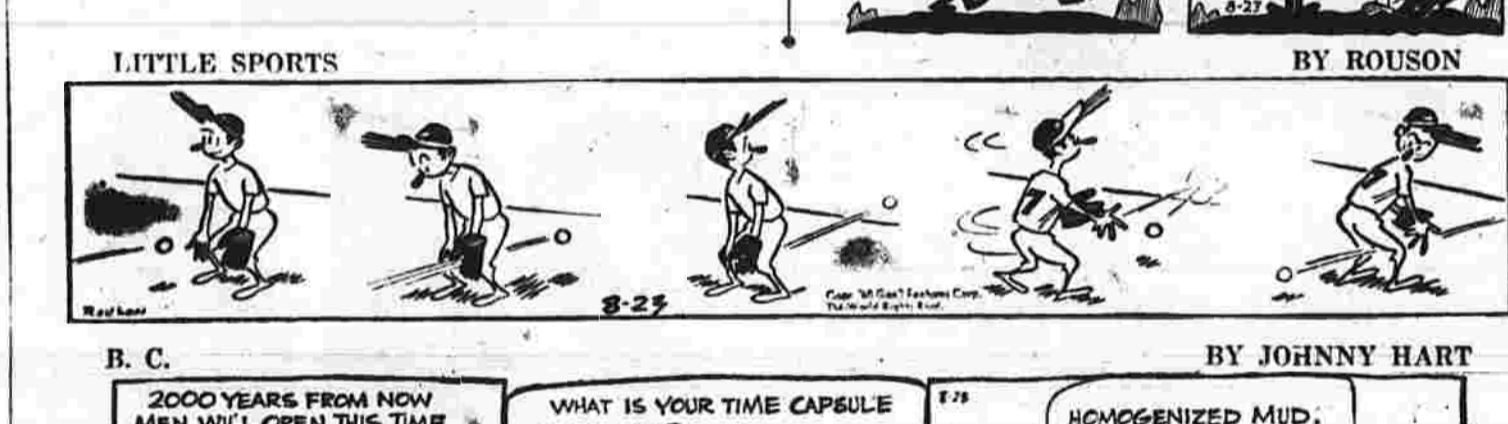
