Fifty-one persons died June 25 when a Brazilian twin-engine Convair plunged into a bay near Rio de Janeiro, across the Atlantic Ocean from today's crash.

The other sea crashes occurred in the Pacific: June 10—29 persons killed when a Trans-Australian airliner fell into the sea off Perth, Australia.

63 Perish In Airliner Off Dakar

Chrysler Suit Asks \$30 Million from Lawyer for Libel

Chrysler said its suit asks damages of more than \$30 million each for various "false, malicious and defamatory" statements which it said were made at different times concerning the company's financial statements and condition, its credit and financing arrangements and the counting of proxy votes at the company's annual meeting last April.

Chrysler said the statements involved dealt with the corporation and its subsidiaries, and that it had been notified of the suit, immediately declared that it "does not intend to be frightened by this lawsuit and if Mr. Colbert (Chrysler board chairman L. L. Colburn) thinks I will not add further defamations he is sadly mistaken."

Today's suit marked the second time Chrysler has gone to court in the running battle which broke into the open with the filing of William C. Newberg as Chrysler president.

Newberg was forced out of the top Chrysler post after only 64 days in office when it was disclosed he had held interests in two firms which did business with Chrysler. Newberg also announced he had agreed to pay the corporation more than \$400,000, representing his share of profits in those two firms.
