Wilhelm Pieck, 84, Dies, President of East Reich

(Continued from Page One) The presidential post was largely honorary, but for Pieck it represented the end of a dogged climb to the top. He was born the son of an unskilled laborer Jan. 3, 1876. During his early years, Pieck worked as a wandering cabinet-maker. He joined the Socialist party in 1905, at the age of 29.

Russia, he made regular German broadcasts over Moscow Radio. He worked among German prisoners at the front and claimed he converted many to communism. Many rumors attended his last years. Five years ago word spread that he had suffered a heart attack.

When Hitler took power, Pieck fled to Paris to direct Communist underground agents remaining in Germany. He lived in Paris until the outbreak of World War II in 1939, when he fled to Moscow.

Still groggy, Puerto Ricans began cleaning up after the killer storm that dealt their island its worst blow in decades and sea foodwaters sweeping across the land.

The spectre of epidemic loomed over stricken areas where dead cattle polluted the water and more victims were likely to turn up as rescuers continued their search.

With the death toll still mounting, Humacao, hardest hit of the Puerto Rican areas, reported 86 bodies recovered. Some 500 persons were reported injured in the area, most of them residents of slum shacks along the beaches.

"Destruction is vast and total in the area," said an aide of Gov. Luis Munoz Marin after visiting Humacao.

Munoz Marin summoned local government leaders to draft an emergency program to cope with the disaster which some feared might exceed the 1932 hurricane when 200 persons were killed and more than 1,000 injured.

Puerto Ricans who had fled after Donna veered north past the island were caught unaware by the raging flood waters that came in the hurricane's wake.

First came floods swollen by 12 inches of rain, then high tide swept in and in a matter of hours wide areas were inundated.

Communications were knocked out in many places allowing up the reports of deaths which began to trickle in from all parts of the island.

Civil Defense officials said about 4,000 persons were affected by floods along the north coast, where helicopters were used to pluck stranded persons from rooftops.

Damages to houses alone was expected to run into millions of dollars. A Civil Defense spokesman said that in one stretch of 50 miles from Carolina on the north coast to Ceiba, 1,000 or more homes were destroyed or damaged.

Six bridges were reported washed out and many key highways were cut.

The heavy casualty toll emphasized the fact that the water threat from hurricanes is more dangerous than wind. Officials said many lives could have been saved if people had moved to high ground.

### Rockville-Vernon Mayor Pushes Budget Cut Of Funds for Rural Police

Rockville Mayor Leo E. Flaherty for a 10-month period, totaling \$1,916,215 and will go before the Board of Finance tonight to request the \$30,000 appropriation for rural police protection out of the proposed 1961 town budget.

The item for police protection in the rural area has been a source of agitation to city residents who object to the budget, which totals \$47,700. The budget, estimated town tax, while supporting a separate police department in Rockville through their city tax.

"It seems to me," the Mayor said, "if the Board of Finance at this point, it would put the responsibility for it up to the Fire Department."

This proposal was defeated by Fire District voters in July at an annual district budget meeting. The Fire District Commissioners had proposed the district assume this cost as a step toward eliminating this and other inequities caused by the three governments in Rockville and Vernon.

Mayor Flaherty said that if the police items were left out of the budget, the district could do either of two things—provide its own police protection, or contract with the city for it.

"I am not proposing these steps," he said.

The Mayor also questioned the snow and ice removal appropriation of \$20,000 in the \$30,000 highway budget. "We pay for this service through our own Public Works Department," Mayor Flaherty said. He said some proportion of the \$30,000 should be assumed by the Fire District.

Spurring the governmental systems in the community, the Mayor said, "We are eventually going to have a town government, or if we continue on with the separate governments besides the town government, these governments should talk over the things in their own areas."

Mayor Flaherty also commented on town recreation. "We provided \$30,000 in the city for recreation this year. The \$1,000 for recreation in the town budget should go right out."

He also criticized expenditures added by the town during the year which are not provided in the original budget. "The town repeatedly comes up with added appropriations," he said, "but in the city we haven't added any appropriations this year in spite of the fact we had several things happen we didn't plan on." He cited unexpected costs in the city as the consolidation referendum, expenses because of a series of fires, added police protection because of several breaks earlier in the year, as well as a series of fires, added police service after the dump was closed.

The Mayor yesterday urged members of the City Council to attend the budget hearing tomorrow night to speak against services for which the city gets no benefit.

Vernon's government's Finance Director Lovrin collected \$1,381,230 on the 1959 tax list as of Sept. 1. In addition she collected \$113,328 in taxes for other years dating back to 1952.

Still to be collected on the 1959 list, due last April is \$103,567, and for years dating back to 1945, a total of \$17,317.

An Fire District Tax Collector, Mrs. Lovrin received \$4,310 up to Sept. 1, the day taxes became due and 11.45 per cent of it was received before the due date.

The district grand list is \$14,860,030 and the mill rate is 2 1/2.
