You Should Know...

Frank P. Sheldon

A Manchester summer school session that should be a highlight in physics or the history of literature or possibly philosophy is the vision of Frank P. Sheldon, one of the three Republicans on the Board of Education.

"It would get the summer school concept away from just remedial work," he has blurted out.

"It would offer a challenge and give the student something to show to a college like Harvard or MIT. And it would be a movement toward a local junior college."

Backs Junior College. Sheldon would like to see Manchester as a junior college operated in the public school buildings as soon as possible.

He secured his own higher education in two installments, the first in 1916 in the Miller College department of accounting, the second in 1919 at the Hartford College of Business Administration.

He received his Charter Life Underwriters degree in 1931, and since then has taken courses during three summers at the University of Connecticut.

On the Board of Education, he is the chairman of the building and sites subcommittee.

His aim is to provide adequate services and facilities for all the children in the town.

Emily Post Dies, Advised Millions On Social Forms

Instill good manners in an active 7-year-old boy to how to address royalty and how to drive your car without an instructor.

But mainly she advised the debutante, the confused and nervous and the newly married couple. She stayed clear of giving luncheon advice.

Her most widely known book, "Etiquette: The Blue Book of Social Usage," has sold more than a million copies through 10 revisions and 89 printings. And for many years she had a radio program and a daily syndicated newspaper column.

She was born Emily Price in Baltimore in 1873, the daughter of an architect. She grew up in her native city and New York surrounded by luxury and secure in social position.

In 1922, she married a banker, Edwin Main Post of the Long Island Tuxedo family. They later divorced.

How did she begin writing? She recalled that early in the century "a friend called me and said 'I had to do something.' She turned the letters she had written her father from Europe into her first book, "The Plight of a Mother," published in 1909.

By 1922, she had written five books. Exasperated over a friend's book that contained what she said was misinformation on etiquette, she set about writing her own handbook on manners. She was on her way.

She founded the Emily Post Institute for "Continuing the tradition of gracious living."

He is a past president of the Manchester Rotary, past vice president of the Manchester Board of Commerce, a member of the YMCA Board of trustees, a 2nd degree Mason, a 4th degree Shriner, and a charter member of the U.S. Naval Reserve.

Joined Marines

During the war he joined the Marines, closing the insurance office he and Richard Carpenter were operating.

He was with the First Division in Guadalcanal, Samoa, New Britain.

Overcrowded Town Meeting To Move to Larger Place

The annual town meeting has been advertised by the Board of Selectmen. It will be held Oct. 3 at 8 p.m. at the Community Hall.

The town meeting is being held for adjournment of the meeting to another location at another time in the event it is for the best interests of the townpeople. The Board of Finance has authorized the temporary borrowing of money in the anticipation of taxes.

Action to rescind an ordinance passed on Oct. 27, 1959 is also an item on the agenda for the meeting. This ordinance asks that all expenditures made by the town be listed by check in the Annual Town Report.

The item is on the agenda at the request of the Board of Finance. The Board feels the listing is unnecessary and wasteful of the town's money. It is pointed out that the accounting of town expenditures is also listed by area of expenditure, a figure more meaningful to the townpeople than the student of town expenditures, and that further itemization of the same can be obtained by a personal examination of records at the town office.

The proposed budget as approved by the Board of Finance requires raising \$500,000 in property taxes next spring. The budget last year anticipated \$283,541 in taxes, a figure that was increased to \$288,000 by additional appropriations before the tax was levied.

Total anticipated expenditures for next year as presented in the budget are \$448,000, an increase from \$304,461 the previous year.

Anticipating only a slight increase in the net taxable grand list from \$3,448,000 to \$3,500,000, the Board of Finance estimates the tax levy next spring will be 32.5 mills. This is an increase of two mills over the current rate.

The budget as approved does not include a specific appropriation for the constables who requested \$15,000. The Board of Finance felt it would be unwise to establish an account which might create a policy department. They felt also that the requested \$15,000 was only a "use in the door" and that such an appropriation, once in the budget, would soon attract to much larger appropriation requests.

A \$300 item was included in the selectmen's account to allow reimbursement of constables for work done in accordance with the law.

The budget above an appropriation of \$175 to the Board of Tax Review, an increase of daily \$15 over the original appropriation last year. The Board of Finance had to a position stated some months ago that no salary increase should be granted during the term of office. The Board of Tax Review had requested a \$2,500 budget appropriation. The \$15 increase was allowed for advertising and other expenses.

Tomassi Urges Junior College Aid to Students

Robert S. Tomassi, Democratic candidate for the Board of Education, today urged State aid for students at local public junior colleges.

Appointment of an education committee to study the establishment of a 2-year liberal arts community college program using Manchester High School facilities is a Democratic party platform plank for the town election next Monday.

Tomassi asked Atty. David Barry and Irving Aronson, Manchester State representatives, to support revision of State aid laws to include students who would attend such a college under State reimbursement to towns for education.

If the State provided about \$100 a pupil, Tomassi said, the town would be able to send a student to the local junior college for about \$250 a year.

The value of such a program would be undiminished, he said, "if the town would keep alive an interest in academic pursuits in those students financially unable to attend a college out of town and those who were unable to gain admission because of the growing number presently listed in the junior college Journal. California alone has 50 junior colleges with an enrollment of more than 375,000. The number of such colleges, especially in the south and midwest, is rapidly increasing.

"The highly developed technological era puts increased emphasis on education beyond the high school," Tomassi concluded.
