Be Tough-Minded, Wary In Choosing Investments
The competition for your thrift dollar is assuming unprecedented proportions. Matter of fact, it is becoming so bitter that I'm afraid someone may get hurt. I'd rather that someone is not you.

The bankers, the Treasury, the insurance industry and the securties marts are pitching against each other for your patronage. Exactly how should you apportion your savings?

An old rule of thumb that still has merit is this: Make certain that you have liquid assets that will-tide you over an emergency period for three months at least. Emergency means serious illness or loss of employment.

If you've got good medical coverage and the absolute assurance of job security, it is debatable whether you should be quite as mindful of this classic formula offered before the days when the erosion of your dollar was the threat it is today.

What form your savings should

What form your savings should take depends upon how much you already have set aside in liquid as-sets, how much you can afford to set aside out of current income. your age, your aspirations and your responsibilities. The smart savers today are seeking the best possible return on their savings dollars.

The danger is in getting too It stems from the hard sell of those bidding for your money and the evidence that you are more subject to convincing than at any other time in the recent past. Think twice before relinquishing

As you advance in years, it becomes increasingly difficult and expensive to get straight life poli While your big aim should be to

make your savings dollars work to compensate the declining purchas-ing power of the dollar, you should ever lose sight of being adequatewhat's been the pattern of ou savings? Figures published by the Securities and Exchange Commis-sion tell the story for 1959. Although the average family's income rose by 4 per cent, savings dropped to 14 billion dollars, 2.5 billion below 1958.

With our savings we bought more U.S. government marketable year. Marketable securities are government issues other than U.S. savings bonds.

Holdings by individuals of these marketable issues rose to 10.4 billion dollars while in 1958 we sold

2.4 billion. Less of our money goes into Savings Bonds. Individuals also switched out of eommon stocks other than invest-ment company or mutual fund shares. We stepped up our pur-chase of the latter by 100 million chase of the latter by 100 million dollars over the previous year.

We invested much more heavily in tax-exempt issues, increasing holdings in state and local government issues to 2.5 billion dollars from 1.2 billion in 1958.

The volume of our savings stashed away in insured and noninsured pension reserves and in savings and loan associations was larger than in any other period. But we bought less private insurance policies.

No one has the dollars and cents answer to this one, but we do know that our mortgage debt zoomed to 13.2 billion dollars from 9.2 billion and that our individual debts grew to 19.4 billion.

Our savings performance leaves little doubt that we are putting our money where the return looks handsomest. To a great extent we have astounded the experts. We have shown they must bid high to get our dollars. Just be wary.
