haunting campaigns since the election in this country has never seen before and would play on work.

While Nixon held back formal concession pending definite word, he was not happy about the victory until Nixon spoke.

Early returns brought a coast outlook for the Democratic nominee.

A solid base for a Kennedy victory built up quickly from winning margins in the two eastern powerhouses — New York and Pennsylvania — together with New Jersey and Massachusetts.

Texas, home of the Democratic vice presidential candidate, Sen. Lyndon B. Johnson, was picked up as was Michigan. Both these states were Republican in the Eisenhower campaign of 1952-56.

But trouble cropped up in the bright picture at that point. Nixon grabbed the states of Kentucky and Tennessee and took Virginia and Florida from the Kennedy solid south as Eisenhower had before him. He won Ohio, ran strong through the Middle West and gained Oklahoma.

So it went on down to the wire, teetering in uncertainty on close races in a handful of states.

Republican National Chairman Thurston Morton in effect conceded in remarks to newsmen at the White House.

"It seems to me he's in," Morton said of the 45-year-old Massachusetts Senator.

Morton said one purpose of his White House call was to thank President Eisenhower for allowing him to help Nixon's campaign.

Secret Service men were already taking duty stations about Kennedy something they do for a presidential candidate but not for a losing candidate.

Kennedy amazed his impressive total by taking the electoral vote of 11 states and winning the support of five of Alabama's 11 electors. The state's other six were uncommitted.

But the Democratic candidate was finding Nixon a difficult man

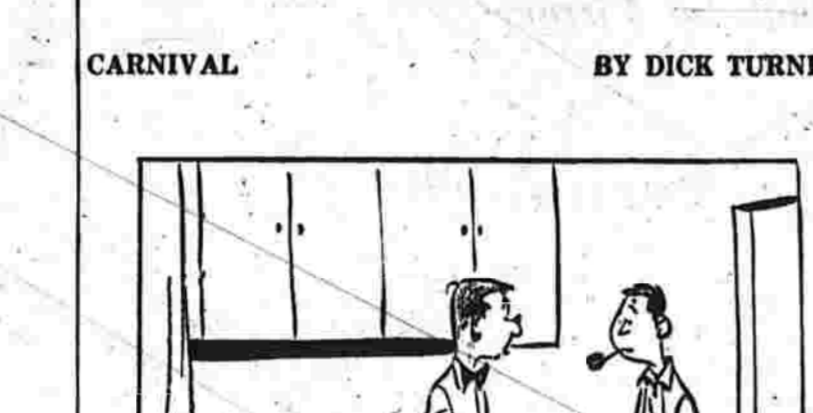
