The Tom Ewell Show

By PAUL GERARD

This is the year of the situation comedy. Laugh machines are at a premium as Hollywood turns out a staggering number of half hour howling seasons designed to tickle the ribs of countless TV buffs.

Many of the new comedies do little more than amuse their own laugh tracks and will be gone after thirteen weeks, while others are favored to go the distance and even remain on the air next season.

One of these favored programs is "The Tom Ewell Show," which got off to good reviews and high ratings from its very first giggle. It is seen Tuesday nights on CBS-TV and stars Ewell as a harassed real estate broker surrounded and victimized by an all girl family.

Tagged for Survival Before the television season

opened. Ewell's show was one of the first to be tagged for survival in the vicious laugh arena where the gladiators rely on guffaws instead of swords to wipe out the competition.

In addition to the star's considerable talents, the series was created by Madelyn Martin and Bob Carroll Jr., the team that turned out a little thing called "I Love Lucy." The producer-director was Hy Averback who guided two year's worth of the highly rated "Real McCoys" and the show was bolstered by a top flight cast headed by Marilyn Erskine, Mabel Albertson and Cindy Robbins.

Strangely enough, while the rest of the television industry was congratulating Ewell before the first episode even went on the air, Ewell himself couldn't be prodded into saying that he had a successful series.

"No one in the world knows whether comedy is funny until it's played," says Ewell. "It's the most unpredictable form of theater, and I honestly didn't know if we had a funny show or not."

Ewell, whose peerless timing and mobile face have kept Broadway laughing from his first hit "John Loves Mary" to his latest triumph in "The Thurber Carnival," is a student of comedy and speaks of it in a scholarly fashion.

"One of the basic laws of comedy," says Ewell, "was taught to me by George Abbott—the minute you think you are funny, no one else does."

Although Ewell often privately analyzes a joke to determine

whether it is funny or falls flat, he doesn't recommend tinkering with a joke in public to see why it produced a laugh.

"If you analyze comedy too deeply, it slips away from you and sometimes can never be recaptured. A friend of mine in a Broadway show found this out the hard way."

"He had a scene with two other actors which always brought a big laugh. Curiosity about which actor deserved the laugh, prompted them to conduct an experiment. One night the man who gave the first line read it somewhat differently while the other two responded normally. No laugh. The next night the middle man read his line somewhat differently as the others played straight. No laugh. The third night the third man read his line differently while the other two read theirs normally. No laugh. They kept this up until all the variations had been tried. Not once did they get a laugh. In desperation they reverted to the original reading but to their surprise didn't even get a snicker. This same scene invariably brought down the house before they began their experiment but somehow they had destroyed their delicate timing and couldn't recapture it. That's what comes from too much analysis in comedy."

If analysis kills comedy, how does a performer determine if a script is humorous?

"I once discussed this problem with Josh Logan," says Ewell, "and he told me how he chooses a play he wants to direct or produce. He said that he gets himself comfortable at home and imagines the play unfolding before him on a stage as he reads it. His only thought about the first reading is whether the play entertains him or not."

"I follow his advice without TV scripts. I imagine it taking place on a television screen. I put aside the consideration of how tough it might be to do. These matters are discussed later on. If it amuses me after the first reading, that's enough. Nine out of ten times I've found that my initial reaction is correct."

In "The Tom Ewell Show," the veteran comedy star often huddles with the writers and makes suggestions. Rarely does he take issue with dialogue but seeks to perfect hits of stage business which has sustained his reputation for being a perfectionist and one of the theater's most respected actors.

Despite his enviable reputation and great knowledge of comedy, Ewell has remained extremely modest.

When a reporter recently asked him whether he regarded himself as a comedian or an actor who plays comedy, Ewell answered, "I regard myself as having worked with clever comedy writers."
