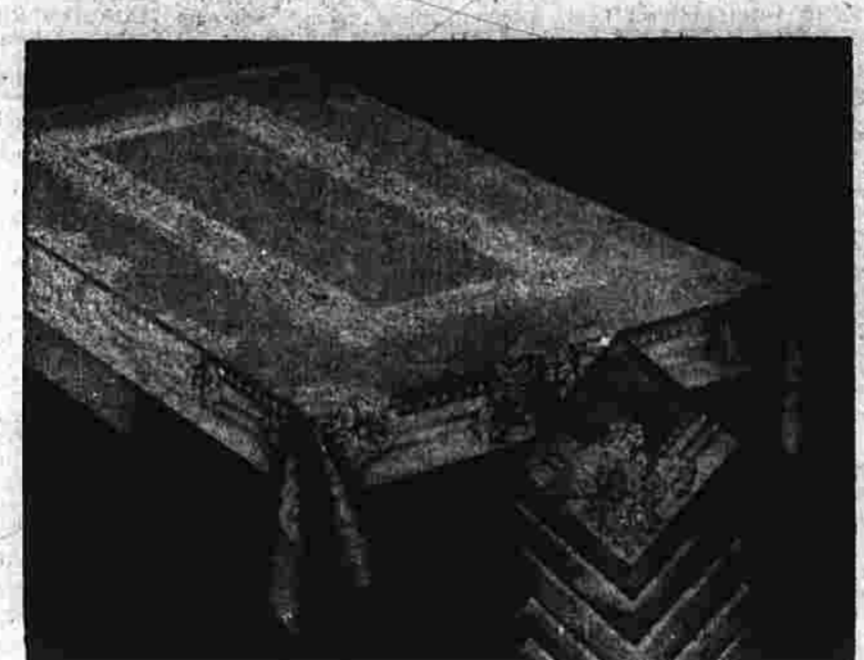

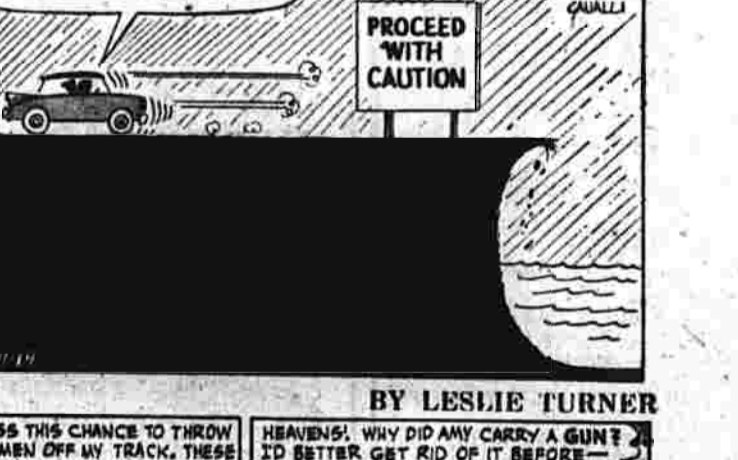

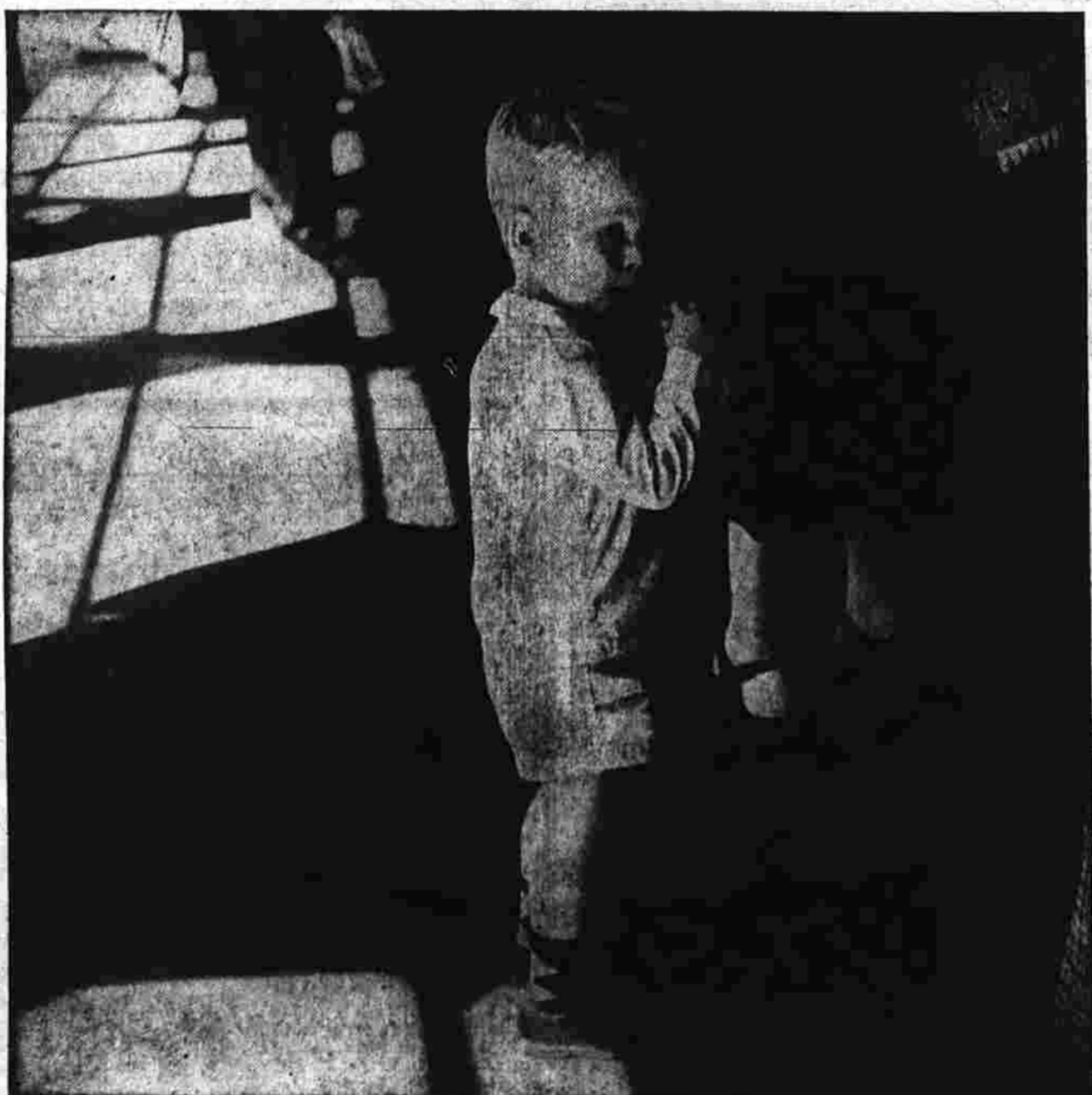

"I hope so," frankly admits TV
writer-producer Jess Oppenheimer
whose "Angel," a new husband and

Oppenheimer was the creative
brains behind "I Love Lucy" and

"Angel" is his new double reverse
switch baby.
Here's the switch, reversed and
still double:
American architect marries
charming French girl with an ac-
cent so fractured as that of Desi
Arnez. A pair of bickering neigh-
bors join in the fun as French cutie
collides, often furiously and tem-
pestuously, with life in the United
States.

"Annie isn't a clown like Lu-
cille," Oppenheimer hastens to add,
"but she has a wonderful sense of
comedy timing and I think her
flair and her accent will go over
big with viewers."

The Annie who is "Angel" is
impish, saucy Annie Farge, who
was born in Paris 23 years ago.
She weighs in at 90 pounds and
stands only five feet tall but she's
all French flair, personality and
continental charm.

Annie was a few minutes late
for our dinner date after a day of
rehearsing on the set and Oppen-
heimer explained:

"She wanted to fix her hair."
When Annie arrived her short,
dark tresses looked as though they
had been set by hurricane Mabel
somewhere along the jet stream.

Later she told me about her
hair, which cued her first clash
with life in America—the ordeal of
becoming a Hollywood TV star.
She wanted to wear it in "Angel"
the way she wears it in Paris.

"A beeg mess, that ees thee way
I like eet," Annie said. "But no,
Mr. Oppenheimer say eet ees too
much of thee mess. So we work on
eet and we compromise. Now eet
is what I call thee organized mess."

Annie, you should know, was
discovered by Josh Logan, who
met her while she was watching
her husband, Dutch-born ballet
dancer Dirk Sanders, rehearse for
a New York show.

Josh visualized her as the star
of his movie, "Fanny," and paid
for her first English language les-
sons. Annie and Dirk were still on
their honeymoon at the time but
by the time Annie had managed to
cope with fractured English she
had a date with the stock.
An agent, meanwhile, had sent

her photo to Oppenheimer and
"Angel" was born in Hollywood as
a pilot reel in December. Leslie, a
daughter, was born to Annie and
Dirk in Paris five months later.

Hoping lightning will strike
twice, Oppenheimer grins:
"Lucille Ball was pregnant, too,
when we made the pilot for 'I
Love Lucy.'"

As an actress with the Comedie
Francaise, Annie says she played
"everything except pin-up girls and
old women." One of her
French audiences by American Ju-
lian Greene, had a pre-U.S. Civil
War background.

After Paris and New York,
Annie is wide-eyed about the wide
open spaces of Hollywood.
"Eet looks like thee cuntry,"
she said. "Any minute I expect
to see Gary Cooper rushing een on
thee horse."

New francs may have put

system, but don't talk about Mr.
de Gaulle's new francs to Annie.
She picked up one U.S. custom
real quick. "I am workeng," she
told me, "Not for new franc but
for lots of old U.S. dollars."
