Palm Beach, Fla., Dec. 5 (AP) -President - elect John F. Kennedy today got a report recommending sweeping Defense Department reorganization-including elimination of the civilian secretaries of Army, Navy and Air Force. The goal would be to give the Secretary of Defense instan-

taneous control in event of nuclear Kennedy by Sen. Stuart Syming-ton, D-Mo., head of a committee which the President-elect set up to plan streamlining of the vast Pentagon operation for the nu-

clear-space age.
Symington told a news conference after conferring with Kennedy that in his opinion his committee's recommendations would cut present military spending by about 20 per cent or \$8 billion annually. But he said this money likely would have to be plowed back for such things as new weapons development and an arms

control program.

While the Symington committee would abolish the civilian secretaries of the Army. Navy and Air Force, those services would be retained as separate entities in the

Defense establishment The plan of Symington, who was secretary of the Air Force in the Truman administration, also would eliminate the undersecretaries and the assistant secretaries-all civili-

ans of the three services. In all, 15 civilian offices would be wiped out in the three services. committee also would abolish seven assistant secretaries of defense, bringing the grand total of offices abolished to 22.
