It is legitimate for us to cry in the order to defend the world from treacherous surprise attack; but since they view themselves as peace-loving, not treacherous, our justification is incredible in their eyes, and our behavior, aggressive.

What we need, and that most urgently, he said, "is an enlightened search for new alternatives to war as a means of resolving human conflicts."

A world government may be the only permanent solution, he said. To halt the arms race, Osgood suggested a one-sided step, and announced people who after negotiations if carefully done, "pressure of public opinion both internal and external would force reciprocation."

Yugoslav businessmen, both private and government-controlled, will have greater freedom of decision, U.S. officials said, and central government control will be reduced.

Minceev said a uniform rate of 750 dinars to the dollar will replace multiple exchange rates now in use. Rates have ranged from 600 dinars to the dollar for tourists up to several thousand in some foreign trade.

The reform will enable Yugoslavia to become a full member of the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (G.A.T.T.). She now is an associate member.

The reform is part of a new 5-year plan beginning Jan. 1. Its aim is to put Yugoslavia on an economic par with sections of western Europe.

A 13 per cent increase in industrial production and a 7.2 per cent increase in agricultural production is envisaged. It is hoped per capita income will increase from \$250 to \$500 annually by 1965.

What, in all these decades, have we, the American people, done to raise the dignity and the living standard of the Cuban people living beyond the resort areas? Has their condition ever really bothered us? Have we ever really tried to help them become like ourselves? Or have we ever really studied out how they might improve themselves in some aspect of their own?

There are all kinds of fringe answers, exceptional answers to such questions. Some American capital, we can believe, played an important, socially-conscious role in Cuba. We can be sure that many American private agencies have tried to help Cuba.

All that being said, there should still be full support for President Kennedy's apparently successful effort to obtain the assurance of key men in Congress that he wants to name career men to important ambassadorships, their lack of private wealth need stand in his way. It is true that, under the present standards of ambassadorship, there is certainly no good reason why there should be an artificial and arbitrary bar against them. A President should have a free hand to pick anyone wherever he thinks he finds the best possibilities; he should be freed from the necessity of finding somebody of great wealth; if he thinks there is a career man who would be outstanding in a certain major post abroad, he should be free to name him. And if he wants to escape from the tradition which assigns the post abroad to those who have demonstrated their wealth by campaign contributions, the American taxpayers should certainly be ready and willing to help him.

Misery On Both Sides

The same supposedly good thing—the grant of freedom to a new nation—is producing starvation in the Congo, and rioting in Belgium.

Yale Doctor Examines Remains of Columbus

Hartford, Dec. 28 (AP)—Samuel Taylor Childers, who wrote the "Ancient Mariner," would probably have been fascinated at today's meeting here of the Archaeological Institute of America.

Dr. Childers, director of the Yale School of Anthropology, reported on his findings during an examination of the remains of Christopher Columbus.

Dr. Childers said the remains were raised from 20 feet of water last spring.

This is the oldest shipwreck yet found, and appears to date from 1500 B.C. or about a century before the war between Greece and Troy, named in Greek writings.

Dr. Childers conducted negotiations with the American embassy in Santo Domingo to obtain the remains of Columbus.

The remains were raised from a site in the Dominican Republic, Trujillo, and were taken to the United States for study.

Dr. Childers said the remains are of considerable scientific interest.

Columbia Wins Award

The first prize in a nationwide Camera Club competition has been awarded to Miss Lois Clarke of Hartford in the show sponsored by the Photographic Society of America.

Miss Clarke's entry, a color slide of the old Mabry mill on the Blue Ridge Parkway in Virginia, was one of six entries from the Nutmegger Camera Club of Hartford in the show sponsored by the Photographic Society of America, which was judged in California.

Miss Clarke was presented with the award at a recent meeting of the Hartford Camera Club.

She is a member of the Connecticut Valley Club and the Hartford Camera Club, both of Hartford.

Miss Clarke has been interested in photography of the sort since 1935. This is not her first important award. About two years ago she won in New England competition, and last fall she took the state award in the photography contest sponsored by Columbia Fair.
