



New Flagpole Up In Center Park

enter Park began the new t week with its third new flag ole in 50 years. The pole and pedestal were original nally designed by Charles Plat a New York architect, in 1910. His plan: called for a 44-foot pered pole. Forty feet of the ole were exposed above ground id the top of the pole was capped y a 21-inch eagle. The eagle still tops the new e, but this pole is an aluminum ne. The first one in 1910 was wood. So was the second one stalled in the early 1940's. The second one gave the Park Department a lot of trouble last month when workers tried to re-move it. Water had seeped into the sleeve in the pedestal, swell-ing the wooden pole. The Park Department tried using jacks to remove the stub of the pole, but rould's hudge it. The stub for a stub for a couldn't budge it.
