



New York, Jan. 16 (AP)-Cryptic underwater sounds hinted today there may be survivors trapped beneath the sea in compartments of a storm-wrecked Air Force radar tower.

Hope that some of the 28 men on the tower may still be alive came today when the destroyer McCaffery picked up "tapping noises" on its sonar equipment near the site of the vanished tower.

"Exchanged tapping signals," the destroyer radiced the Coast Guard here. "Now has heard what may be human voice over sonar. Definite possibility survivors trapped in tower structure."

The destroyer said it was attempting to send down divers to probe the underwater remains of the tower. Sonar is an underwater

sound-detection system. "Structure is entirely below surface depth," the message said. "Request all possible salvage assistance earliest."
