
Washington, Jan. 27 (AP)-Under tight security wraps, the two RB47 fliers released from Russian imprisonment flew home to America today and got a hearty welcome from President Kennedy and their families.

Bareheaded in the cold, Kennedy greated the filers at nearby An-drews Air Force Base but passed up a chance to make a public speech of welcome over TV. No inreviews with the men were permit-ted for the time being. Pierre Salinger, presidential press secretary, said this was be-cause the State Department did not

want to jeopardize prospects improving relations with Russis improving relations with Russia. Capts. John R. McKone, 28, and Freeman B. Oimstead, 25, landed at 11:58 a.m. E3T at Andrews Al Force Base, Md., after a 7-month ordeal of imprisonment by the
