**Rockville-Vernon
Truck Driver
Absolved in
Tolland Fatal**

Tolland County Coroner Bernard J. Ackerman has absolved a Rhode Island truck driver of any crime in connection with the death of Mrs. Elizabeth D. Kilduff, 74, of Bristol, who died of injuries received in a crash in Tolland Nov. 22.

In making his finding, Ackerman observed that "had the deceased worn a seat belt on that occasion she would not have been thrown against the windshield... and undoubtedly would be alive today."

Ackerman said evidence showed that the truck driver, Joseph E. Flores, of Middletown, R. I., was not aware of a small break in the tractor-trailer as he came off the highway to enter Rt. 44 on his way to Newport, R. I.

The truck collided with the front of a car driven by John A. Kilduff, 61, who said he saw the truck, but had no time to avoid the crash.

Mrs. Kilduff's husband had been thrown against the dashboard and windshields. Mrs. Kilduff died the next day.

"At the time of the accident," Ackerman said, "it was not apparent that the injuries were fatal. Ackerman said findings of his inquest indicated Flores had no previous knowledge of the damaged air brakes line. Flores has an unblemished motor vehicle operating record for more than 34 years, Ackerman said.

"I am satisfied that Flores did everything a reasonably prudent operator could do under the circumstances," Ackerman said.

**Minuteman Scores
Amazing Success**

Once the missile is perfected, the Air Force plans the fastest delivery in missile history with at least 500 Minuteman's to be deployed by 1964. About 400 of these will be placed on the west coast of the United States in underground sites designed to survive a near miss by a nuclear bomb. The remainder will be on special railroad trains.

Defense planners are talking of eventually having 2,000 Minuteman on station.

As the Minuteman force is built up, the so-called missile gap between this country and Russia will begin to close, many military experts predict. Many predict both nations will be even in number of strategic nuclear weapons.

The range of the Minuteman will be as great as 10,000 miles. Construction is expected to start on 200-foot deep silos and launchers for three 500-mile Minuteman squadrons at Malmstrom Air Force Base near Great Falls, Mont.

Once in place, the missiles will be manned and guarded only through remote control. Each silo will be manned by a 100-man concrete bunker. Nearby will be an underground electronic control center where the Minuteman squadrons at Malmstrom Air Force Base near Great Falls, Mont.
