Officials of Rockville and Vernon Fire Districts are still close to a solution to the town trash problem today, but they were not sure that they had a permanent solution.

However, the group approved taking out options on three parcels of land in Vernon as possible future disposal sites, and Donald E. Lewis, chairman of the Vernon Fire District Board of Commissioners, said he will buttonhole Vernon selectmen Thursday to see if they will pitch in and help in the matter.

The selectmen have so far stayed out of the matter. The trash disposal problem, said to be a town-wide problem rather than a confined site, is the result of the fire district.

What the selectmen can do about it is not clear. The town of Vernon, under the statutes, cannot maintain a dump or trash disposal program, it is left to the town to buy property not specifically for a dump then lease or rent it to it to either city or district for temporary relief.

The meeting last night, the third in as many weeks, bogged down on the legal obstacles to the town's dissatisfaction with three suggested ways of disposing of rubbish.

As for the other health measures Kennedy recommended, the House passed the bill on Feb. 8. The bill provides for \$1.2 billion in new appropriations for the fiscal year starting July 1, and that about \$11 million of this amount would be spent in the first 12 months.

For the next fiscal year, beginning July 1, 1962, appropriations are figured at about \$171 million and actual spending at about \$50 million.

Some of the programs Kennedy advocated are on a 10-year basis, and the administration estimates that the cost would continue to mount through the first four years, and then level off.

Kennedy did not go into any detail regarding prior laws in his message. He has promised, however, that he will suggest ways of raising additional revenue in the case of all new spending programs which would knock out of balance the budget inherited from the last fiscal year commencing July 1.

Outstanding health insurance for the aged, Kennedy told Congress, "This program was established by an increase in the Social Security contributions of one-quarter of one per cent each on employer and employee, and by an increase in the maximum amount of wages from \$4,800 a year to \$5,000 which would amply cover the cost of all insurance benefits provided. The system would be self-supporting and would not place any burden on the general revenue."

"This means that apart from the increase in the Social Security tax over the next several years in the existing Social Security program—the tax would go from the current 3.1 per cent to 3 1/2 per cent. This would be paid by both workers and employers on the first \$4,000 of wages; thereafter, the rate is \$1.80 a year as at present.

"Payment of health insurance benefits would be continued for those workers earning at least \$4,000 a year.
