### Castro Seeking To Repair U.S., Cuba Relations

The Salvadoran ambassador to Cuba was recalled in mid-January and never returned here. El Salvador has now been asked to leave there as soon as he can.

The United States, Guatemala, Peru and the Dominican Republic previously cut official relations with Cuba. Four other nations — Haiti, Nicaragua, Paraguay and Colombia — have pulled their ambassadors out of Cuba.

After El Salvador announced the break, the Cuban Foreign Ministry released a statement saying El Salvador's government was an imperialist military junta that Cuba never recognized anyway.

In seeking Venezuela as a center for its rift with the United States, Cuba chose a nation that believes in working with OAS for cooperation.

### Rockville-Vernon Charter Bill Unopposed In Hearing

The bill to empower the three governments of Vernon to act as a consolidation and charter commission and to bring a single government to referendum in the summer went without opposition today in a hearing before the cities and boroughs committee of the state legislature.

The hearing began at 10:45 a.m. and was concluded in about half an hour with a dozen people officials of Rockville, Vernon and the Vernon Fire District, speaking in favor of the measure.

Mayor Leo B. Flaherty Jr. of Rockville spoke first at the request of Vernon Reps. Raymond E. Spelman and Gerald Allen. Alva Harvey, a Yonkers, Robert D. King and Robert F. Kahan, counsels for the city, fire district and town, respectively.

Also, Robert F. Kingsbury, former fire district commissioner; Atty. Herbert Hamann, a member of the one-line consolidation and charter commission; James S. Sullivan, executive secretary of Rockville Area Chamber of Commerce; William R. Egan, Rockville manufacturer; Nat. W. Schwere, and District Chairman Donald B. Lovett.

BID THREE SUITS TO SHOW SINGLETON

By Alfred Sheinwold

Continuing this week's series on slam bidding, we go on to the kind of slam that depends on partnership "fit." You bid a slam if you have a useful singleton or void suit, but you stay out of slam if the singleton is useless.

As the cards lie, South can easily make six spades against a club lead. (The singleton heart opening would be more troublesome, but then it should be a trump in a caplan to show his singleton diamond. Then it will be up to South to decide whether or not he likes that singleton.)

The standard method of showing a singleton is to bid the other suit. You bid a slam if you have a useful singleton or void suit, but you stay out of slam if the singleton is useless.

Mrs. Paul Poo, he said, had given birth to three mongoloid (mentally retarded) children, who quickly died, Harper said. The chief justice took up the case of Mrs. Doe in questioning Burton. "Even if it is conceded the lady would die," Warren said, "you still hold that the state has the right for the reasons you give, to prevent her from getting the needed care?"

"Yes," Cannon replied, "plus the added factor that when seeking the advice she was not suffering from a disease that affected her health. Pregnancy was not involved. He (the physician) may advise that if she became pregnant she might injure her health, but he can't tell her or advise her to use artificial contraceptives to prevent conception.
