





Algeria Rebels, French to Talk

(Continued from Page One) "Considering the recent developments of the Algerian problem, the three chiefs of state esteem that there ought to be no further obstacles to the opening of direct negotiations between the French government and the provisional government of the Algerian republic for independence in the framework for total decoloniza-They also "reaffirmed their de-

termination to build the Grand Maghreb." This is the Arabic expression for a political and eco-nomic grouping of North Africa. The world magnreb means far west, in this case the far west of the Arab world. De Gaulle views this plan with enthusiasm because it would provide a means for France to retain ties with its former colonies and, hopefully, to neutralize the die-hard opposition of Algeria's European settlers to independence. European settlers to independence.

The rebel move came after weeks of delicate diplomatic maneuvering that brought Bourguiba and De Gaulle together on Monday in a session that apparently removed major differences.

During the past weeks there were also definite signs that the French were already in direct contact with rebel representatives on a lower level.

Although spirits on both side of Although spirits on both side of the Mediterranen appeared high-ly optimistic, there were some caution flags in the air.

The communique from Rabat was phrased in the conditional tense and did not specify that all obstacles to negotiations had definitely been swept away.

Terrenoire, speaking for the French cabinet, stressed that the negotiations should also include French cabinet, stressed that the negotiations should also include "all tendencies" (factions) in Aigeria. This would weaken the rebels contention that they alone are qualified to speak for Algeria.

However, these appeared relatively minor points to most observers. There was no doubt that these subjects had been covered in Monday's talks between Bourguiba and De Gaulle. At the end of that meeting both sides gave the impression that they were not going to haggle over details.
