South's slam seems to depend on the club finesse. In fact, if West opens a club, South must try the finesse at once—going down, of course, when the finesse loses. When West makes a nore favorable opening lead, South has another chance.

South wins the diamond with the king and queen, and cashes the rest of his high cards in the red suits. The next step is to lead a trump to dummy's ace and return a heart from dummy.

Discard Loser

When East follows suit with the jack of hearts, South should discard a club instead of ruffing. This discard cannot cost anything, for South must lose a club trick sooner or later even if the club finesse should win.
