Kennedy first hurt his back as a youth. The injury was severely aggravated when the PT boat he commanded as a Navy lieutenant during World War II was sliced in half by a Japanese destroyer. Dr. Travell replied she had not prescribed the rocker, but that Kennedy has it because he saw one just like it in her New York office when he first came to her
