SWITCH FROM HOPELESS SUIT

It's a fine idea to lead a long suit against a notrump contract; you hope to set up your suit and run it against declarer. If you run into a roadblock, however, keep flexible enough to change your mind and switch to another suit.

West opened the three of diamonds in the hope that his high cards in spades and hearts would give him the lead often enough to develop his long suit. A reasonable idea, but it didn't work out.

Declarer played the low diamond from dummy and the ace and king and promptly led a spade toward dummy's king.

At this stage West would have the whole hand. South surely had the ace of clubs, for otherwise he would lead clubs immediately to force out the ace. South could not do this, however, since his bid of one notrump showed a weak hand.

It was clear that South had diamonds headed by K-Q, since East would have played the ten from A-J-10. In short, West was that action was needed to stop declarer from taking six clubs, two diamonds and a heart.

West's first step was to put up the ace of spades. Each follow-up was a doubleton. West tried to signal his strength. West led the ace of hearts, but that was what his partner thought about this. But East played the diamond. Hence West led the other spade through dummy's king.

Now the defenders were in position to get three spades, two hearts, and the ace of diamonds. South had to settle for six clubs, one diamond, and one spade to avoid going down two.

The Daily Question

Partner opens with 1 NT (18-19 points), and the responder bids 2 NT. You hold: Spades—A 6; Hearts—A Q 8 4; Diamonds—8 5 3 2; Clubs—5 2. What do you bid?

Answer: Bid two clubs, the Stayman Convention. This promises nothing as to clubs; it merely asks partner what he has in suit if he can. If partner has four

Crazy Quilt of Drinking Laws

New York (NEA) — Blush, Sellers, anybody can be a criminal. But it takes real brains to obey some of our laws.

Ponder, for example, our crazy-quilt drinking legislation as it states and turns from state to state to county to municipality—and then see what it adds up to.

In New Jersey and Connecticut you have to be 21 to buy a drink but only 18 to get a driver's license. So you can drive to adjoining New York state, buy any number of drinks at the age of 18, and then drive home—more or less on the road.

In some areas you have to bring your own bottle, buy mixed, and take your bottle home again. In other areas, you have to buy a sealed bottle and leave what you don't finish—or finish it all, if you want to be frugal (an odd drink if you're under 21—unless you're married; or in New Mexico if you're a lunatic, or in Nevada if you're an imbecile, or in Illinois if you're a fanatic, or in California if you're a fanatic, or in some other state where some officials intervene).

But perhaps as important as all other conditions is the one according to president of the California Wine Institute Dan McCooly: "The public is treated as if they are children."

Redistricting Backed

Hartford, March 22 (AP)—Members of the Legislature's Judiciary Committee have recommended passage of a bill to redistrict the state.

If voted into law, the redistricting would be the first since 1903. Recommendations contained in the bill were compiled by a bipartisan committee headed by the Hon. George W. Cooke of Trinity College.

Cooper told the Judiciary Committee yesterday that the bill would make the population of senatorial districts range from a low of 47,000 to a high of 83,000.

The present population range is about 30,000 to more than 150,000.

He said this range would make certain no district was more than twice the population of another.

Cooper recommended that the make-up of districts be reviewed every decade because population growth, and movements may require changes.

Republicans, who control the House, have already indicated support of Cooper's recommendations. Democrats, however, have not taken a stand on the report, although they have pledged in their platform they would favor some sort of redistricting.

The favorable report by House members of the Judiciary Committee was interpreted as a Republican move to lose the issue into the laps of the Democrats, who control the Senate.

The Democrats traditionally have been hesitant about redistricting the Senate because it would cut into their strength in cities.

Union Drops Opposition

Hartford, March 22 (AP)—The bus drivers union has withdrawn its opposition to sale of the Connecticut Company's Norwich-New London division to Thames Valley Transit, Inc.

The union's withdrawal permitted the Connecticut Public Utilities Commission to reaffirm yesterday its approval of the sale.

The Connecticut State Conference Board of the Amalgamated Association of Street, Electric Railway and Motor Coach Employees of America has initially opposed the transfer on grounds certain employees would lose pension and other rights.

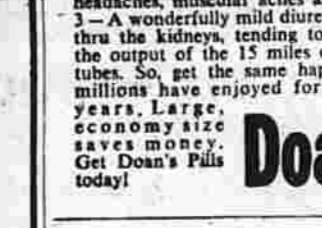

 Refrigerators are built on low platforms, making stooping unnecessary. Showers with Alaskan cedar seats are built on low platforms. These are among 36 special features which the Housing Authority of San Antonio, Tex., incorporated into this city's Victoria Plaza. This one-story, 165-unit, low-rent apartment development was designed by Thomas R. Thompson for people past 60.

A new reproduction of a Victoria Plaza apartment at the National Housing Center, Washington, D.C. The exhibit was arranged in connection with the White House Conference on Aging.

Located less than a mile from the center of San Antonio, the apartment building is in the shape of a modified T, with cross ventilation for each unit.

Two of the four-story elevators have special safety devices. Corridors have four-foot-high railings. Doors are extra-wide and have no thresholds, to accommodate wheel chairs.

Sixteen of the apartments have two bedrooms. Another 16 are one-bedroom units. Each has a full bathroom. A screen covered with easily cleaned vinyl fabric separates the kitchen area from the living room.

Shelves and light fixtures are built into the walls. So, it isn't necessary to change a lamp or TV set at a convenient height.

The building table is by the window. The bed is so located that a wheel chair has direct access to the bath. There is a night light between the bedroom and bathroom.

There is a best lamp in the ceiling. Window sills are low, so that a bedridden person may have a view. In addition to a shower seat, bathroom fixtures include a shower without curb and with tempered glass doors that permit water speed and heat to be adjusted before entering the shower; grab bars and emergency bell.

Another alarm bell is in the corridor roof at each apartment. But other Victoria Plaza assets are acoustical ceiling, specially floors, conveyor cabinets at windows to provide safe heat and a shelf for linoleum and plants and a generous amount of storage space, with as much as possible at middle height.

What and Why of Anemia
 And a Warning on Vitamins
 By HAROLD T. HYMAN, M.D.
 Written for Newspaper Enterprise Assn.

In accepting the Goldberger award, offered by the American Medical Association and the Nutrition Foundation, Dr. Richard W. Viter of the University of Cincinnati emphasized the following aspects of the anemia problem that had previously been called to the attention of regular readers of this column:

1. White dietary deficiency is a common cause for anemia in underdeveloped areas of the world; it is of relative unimportance in the United States, thanks to the general excellence of the American diet.

2. Daily servings of lean meat, dairy products, cereals, green and yellow vegetables and citrus fruits satisfactorily guard against deficiency anemia.

3. Uncontrolled treatment of anemia with complicated vitamin-mineral mixtures is rarely useful. It may be dangerous if it delays diagnosis into the more frequent causes for anemia, such as chronic bleeding from a non-malignant condition like hemorrhoids or from a malignancy which will not respond to curative treatment.

4. Even in the 4 per cent of anemia due to vitamin deficiency in laboratory animals. And when B12 is the cause for a human anemia, the deficiency may be corrected by a single monthly injection of the missing ingredient.

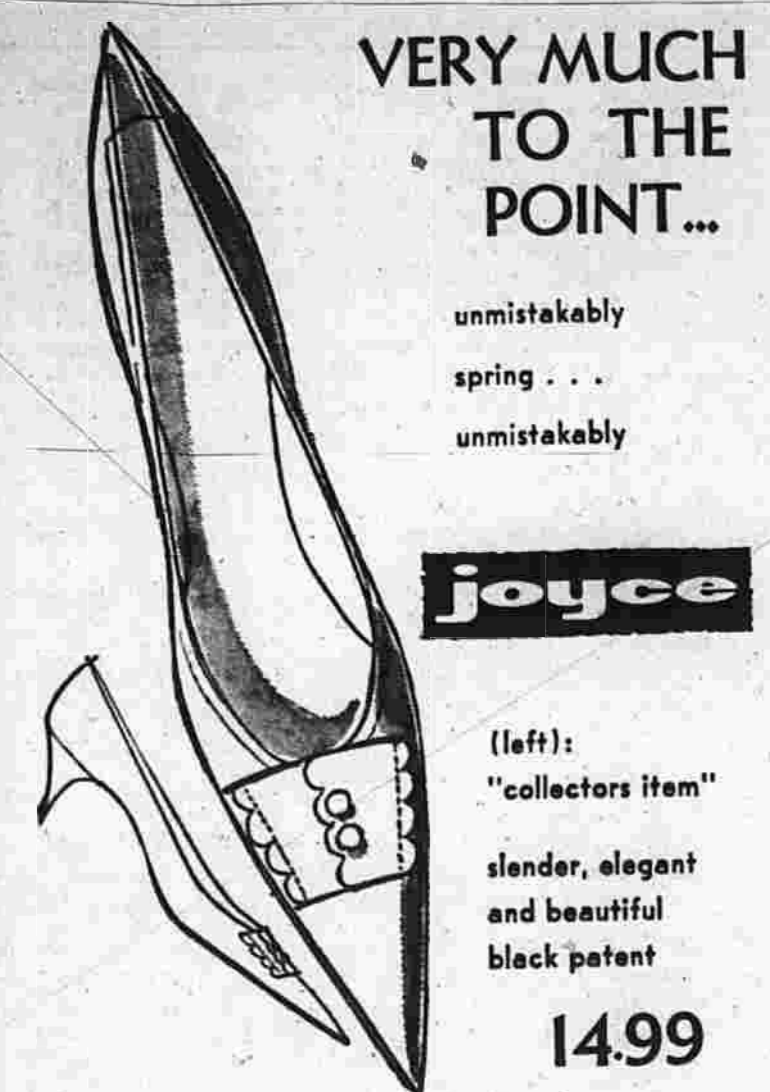

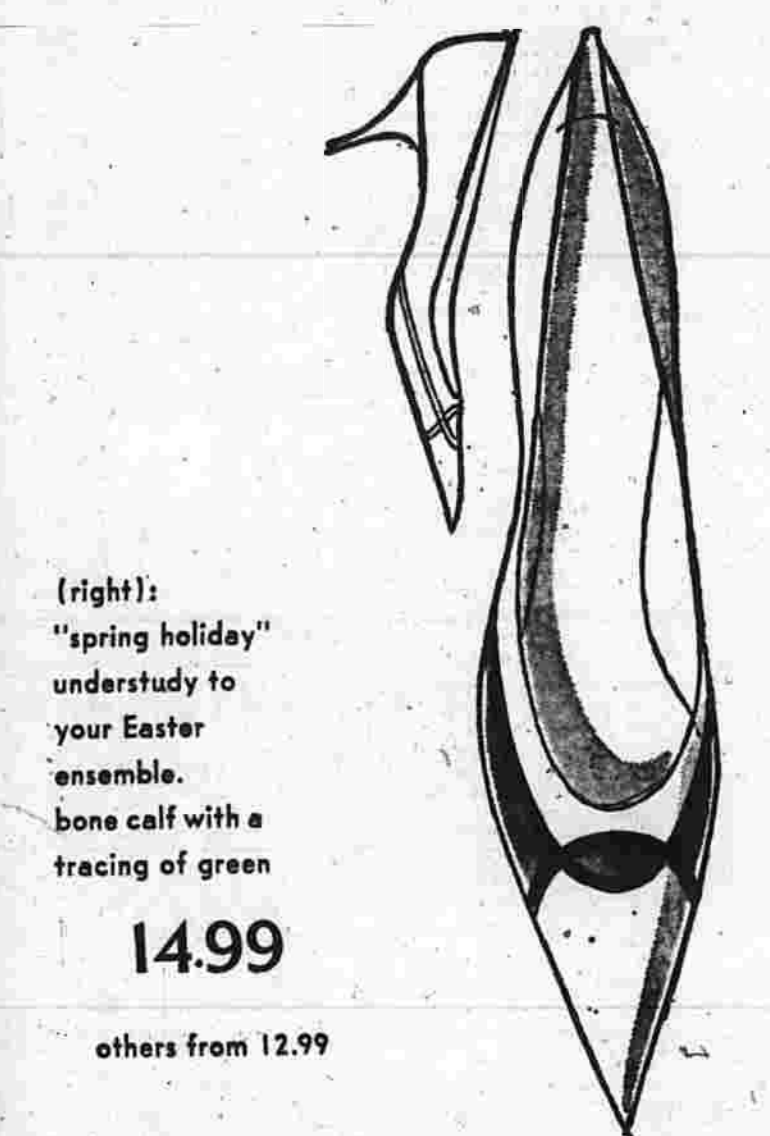

U.S. Urges UN Start African Aid Project

United Nations, N. Y., March 23 (AP)—The United States today called on the United Nations to work out an African development program that "is by and for the Africans."

At the same time, the U.S. urged exclusion of the Cold War from the African continent.

The U.S. views were outlined by Chief Delegate Adlai E. Stevenson before the United Nations committee of the U.N. General Assembly. He was the first speaker on the problem of aiding in the development of the newly independent African nations.

"Only Africans can develop Africa," Stevenson said in his opening remarks. "The United States will support the African program, which never planned the resolution stage. The delegation has been circulating a tentative resolution among the African nations for the past week, trying to formulate a plan that will give the Africans what they need and want rather than what other nations think they ought to have."

U.S. Urges UN Start African Aid Project

He outlined two basic principles for an African aid program:

1. Contributors should be prepared to assist the African countries in their efforts to assess their own resources as they are revealed through the process of development.
2. The United Nations should also recognize the need for diversification of agriculture and the expansion of industry.

"I hope this committee can contribute to a really effective program for the nations of Africa, to help them fulfill their aspirations," Stevenson declared.

He did not spell out what expenditures would be involved in such a program, but added: "All of this will cost a lot of money and a lot of manpower."

He declared that the program should be examined on its merits and divorced entirely from any military aspects.

"I prefer to think our policy should be justified by an enlightened self-interest," he asserted.

New York, March 23 (AP)—The leader of two Cuban exile groups pledges that the overthrow of Fidel Castro will be followed by firing squads and a new election.
