




SWITCH FROM HOPELESS SUIT By Alfred Sheinwold

It's a fine idea to lead a long suit against a notrump contract; you hope to set up your suit and run it against declarer. If you run into a roadblock, however, keep flexible enough to change your mind and switch to another suit.

Both plans are intended to relieve flooding conditions below the hill on which Manchester Memorial Hospitar is situated.




