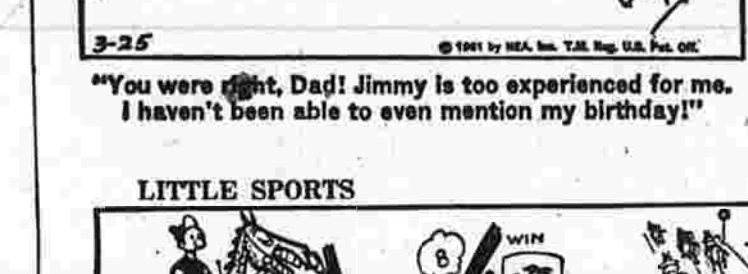

Statistics Tell Story Of Town's Economy

Manchester ranks 16th in population, 14th in retail sales, and 34th in manufacturing of the 169 towns in Connecticut, according to statistics on the town's economy released by William Sleith, vice president of Trade Development of the Manchester Chamber of Commerce.

The report follows a Trade Development Committee study in conjunction with the Research Department of the State Development Commission.

Manchester's official 1960 U.S. Census Bureau population figure is 42,102. This represents a population density of 1,531 persons per square mile of the town's 27.5 square miles.

Effective buying income as of 1959 lists here at \$35,344,000 or 18 per cent of the State's total income after federal income taxes. The per capita income is \$2,303, while per household income is listed at \$7,880. This represents an increase in income of about \$600 per family over 1958, Sleith said.

In 1959, according to figures released by the Sales and Use Tax Division of the Connecticut Tax Department, retail sales were \$66,900,000, or a per capita retail sales of \$1,589.

Manchester had 2,589 persons covered by the Connecticut Unemployment Compensation Act. This represents 0.7 of the state's total manufacturing employees and includes 67 plants.

Sleith said that "We believe this figure to be somewhat higher when you consider that many plants, such as C. R. Barr and Weistone, for example, do not come under this classification."

"The Chamber's Industrial Directory lists over 90 establishments," he said. "Two plants, the Monomet Co. and Displaycraft, were added this year by the Chamber in locating and relocating their plants," Sleith said.

State Research Coordinator Charles Hill said, "The Chamber is doing a good job in this field," Sleith reported. Hill pointed out that the average size of industries locating in the state is averaging about 40 employees per firm, Sleith said.

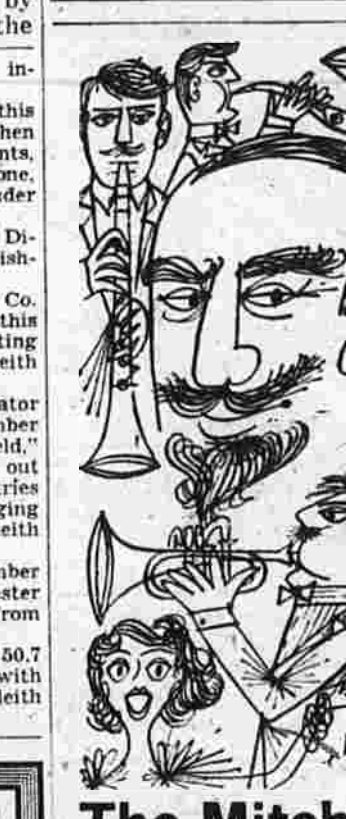

Who'd Expect a Horse To Supply Answers?

There's an old comic song titled, "Horses Don't Bet On People." If the reverse were the case, the sport which yearly draws the largest attendance would fold up and become again the "Sport of Kings" only, and television would be without its newest entry in the situation comedy race for honors.

The new comedy series "Mister Ed" starring comedian Alan Young and an egotistical palomino named "Mister Ed" was to be called "The Alan Young Show."

"I decided to play it safe," Alan said. "Why should I take the rap if the show bombs? It's Ed's show, and I say if he's working like a horse, then let him worry like a horse."

Actually, Alan has a great deal of faith in the success of the series. And so has the automobile manufacturer whose dealers are very enthusiastic about its future. It is now being seen on a syndicate station-to-station basis in 112 markets.

The brains behind "Mister Ed's" conception belong to Arthur Lubin and Al Simon who, a few years ago, did several "Francis the Mule" movies, which dealt with a talking mule.

In the series, Alan plays an architect who, with his wife, moves into the country and finds that he

Davalos for Liberty; Film Pact Broken

The co-starring role in NBC-TV network's full-hour Civil War drama series, "The Americans," is filled by a young man who not long ago begged for a chance to give up a promising motion picture career.

Like the character he portrays—Corporal Jeff Canfield of the Army of the Confederacy—Dick Davalos is young, handsome and comes equipped with quick impulses and blunt sensitivities. He also possesses an impressive roster of acting credits encompassing the Broadway stage, Hollywood films and quality TV specials. "The Americans" marks his debut, at age 25, in a continuing TV role.

Davalos says "I want to be my own man and resent any interference with living my own life." Once, he demanded and secured release from the only motion picture contract he ever held.

Born in the Bronx, New York City, Davalos started acting when he was five—in a Rye, N.Y., boarding school production of "Snow White." No dwarf, Dick played the role of the magic mirror.

He remained the headliner of school theatrical productions during subsequent scholastic years at New York City's P. S. 89 and Christopher Columbus High School, and made his professional debut, shortly before graduation at age 16, with the Chapel Theatre Players in the title role of "Hans Brinker."

Upon discharge from a hitch in the Navy, as an ordinary seaman, young Davalos enrolled in the Martha Graham School of the Dance in New York—"partially because of the newly acquired coordination of my sea legs and partially to diversify myself as an entertainer."

But he soon realized that emphasis on movement alone was not enough, and he began studying under Uta Hagen at the Herbert Berghof Studio, also in New York. Studio contacts led to a few minor roles off Broadway and on television, and these led to a successful screen test for a role (as brother to the character portrayed
