#### **Dreir Started** To Hop Globe As Youngster

Alex Dreir, ABC news Chicago commentator and well kwown "man-on-the-go" has been globe hopping since he first left his native Hawaii as a youngster to go to school in California.

Born in Honolulu, where his grandfather served as an advisor to Hawaii's last queen, Dreir attended grammar school in the islands and military school and college in California. After being graduated from Stamford University with a degree in political science, he joined the United Press news bureau in San Francisco. science, he joined the United Press news bureau in San Francisco. Later he was assigned to the New York desk, and in 1940 was transferred to the foreign bureau in Berlin, where a year later he began broadcasting for NBC.

From his post in the German capital, Dreir depicted life in that country and the occupied territories. He pulled no punches in these reports, much to the annoyance of the Nazis. As a result, he was ordered out of Germany in

he was ordered out of Germany in November, 1941.

After broadcasting from New York and Chicago for a year, he was sent by NBC News to Lon-don to cover the North African invasion invasion.

Following the war, Dreir continued his career in broadcasting. With Chicago now his base, he re-turned to Europe in 1945, 1947, 1949, 1950 and 1953. He was in Berlin during the Poznan riots in 1956 and interviewed the first eyewitnesses to reach the West from Poland. During the same trip, he flew to Moscow and broadcast daily to the United States and while there witnessed the signing of the Yugoslav-Soviet friendship pact.

Dreir, maintaining one of the busiest schedules in broadcasting today is in great demand as

today, is in great demand as a public speaker, fulfilling engage-ments which take him throughout the United States.

Washington, March 27 (AP)-President Kennedy and Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko separately voiced hopes today that a peaceful solution of the Laotian crisis can be

Speaking for Kennedy, White House press secretary Pierre

"He continues to be hopeful that there will be agreement between the parties concerned which will permit a cessation of hostilities and the development of a neutral and independent Laos.

Gromyko a few moments earlier said after a 56-minute conference with Kennedy that:

"The President and I, after our conversations, expressed the hope that possibilities would be found of settling the Laotian question peacefully.' Gromyko added that they expressed hope for an agree-

ment on peaceful development of a policy of neutrality. The two men met in Kennedy's oval office, flanked by advisers. Then they stepped out into the White House garden on a warm, sunny day, sat down on a wooden bench and continued to talk alone.

Gromyko speaks English, although he used an interpreter during the main part of the conference.

Kennedy and Gromyko went-back inside and met again briefly with their advisers. While they were in the garden, Mrs. Kennedy came up and shook
