The proposed General Fund budget calls for the expenditure of \$368,000 for Capital Improvements. This includes \$170.000 for a Public Works garage and \$140.000 for storm sewer projects which have been contemplated for several years. These two needs could be financed with a bond issue. A bond issue could be sold for example to include this \$310,000, the \$330,000 for the Mary Chency Library, the \$680,000 for the school building renovation of last year, the \$160,000 sanitary sewer projects now underway and \$300,000 to provide a central firehouse at the Center and one on land owned by the Town on McKee Street. The recommended 44 mill tax rate could thus be reduced by two mills.

BOARD OF EDUCATION The Board of Education appropriation provides for salary increases to teachers, salary and wage increases to other school employes and for some expansion of school services. As always the cost of providing schools and of operating them is the largest part of the budget and the bulk of the annual tax rate. This table shows the tax rate each year for 12 years required for school purposes and for all other Town purposes. The

FIRE DEPARTMENT The appropriation for the Town Fire Department continues the program to bring up its staff to meet Fire Underwriter recommendations. It provides for preparation of plans and specifica-tions for two new firehouses, one at the Center to replace a fireouse built for horse-drawn equipment, on land we do not own and from which the fire fighting apparatus has to go through a school playground.

WATER and SEWER DEPARTMENTS

Water and Sewer Department appropriations provide for establishing a Capital Improvement Reserve Fund for each utility. When this is done the recurring annual operating receipts and costs of each can be considered separately from system extensions and improvements and the financing of the latter can be planned on a continuing basis.

"No annual budget stands alone. Each reflects things that were No annual budget stands alone. Each reflects things that were done or were not done in prior years. Decisions this year to do or not to do will affect next year's budget.

During these years of expanding services and of increasing costs of hiring people and buying temmodities, the cost of government to the taxpayers can be expected to increase perceptibly each year. There is merit in trying to stabilize tax rate increases rather than to have large increases in some years.

The 31 mill rate for 1957-58 was continued for 1958-59 despite an increase in expenditures that warranted an increase of three mills. This caused part of the jumn of five mills for 1959-60. Again the increase of nine-tenths of a mill for 1960-61 did not provide for the governmental services and needs for this year, resulting in part in the recommendation for a seven mill increase

If tax rates are to be cut, expenditures and the services for which they are proposed should be cut.

PROPERTY TAX BURDEN Manchester has a high percentage of home owners. This is probably one of the reasons that Manchester has so many fine people. A considerable number of these home owners have been retired for several of the last dozen years of growth in school population, costs and tax rates. They are on fixed incomes and make little use now of various Town government services. Increases in property taxes is an acute burden on these people par-It is not possible, of course, to adopt a budget directly for the benefit of these people to the exclusion of others. Unfortunately, the Connecticut tax structure, which the Town can-not change, required that all of the increased cost of schools and other services must be added to the property tax burden.

The public hearing on this Tentative Budget will be held by the Directors Wednesday, April 5, 1961, at 8:00 p.m. in the auditerium of the new Illing Junior High School. It can be adjourned by the Directors. No appropriation can be made that is greater than the departmental request or the Manager's recommendation, whichever is larger. The Directors have until May 7, which is a Sunday, to adopt




