





## U.S. Has 59 Missiles State News With H-Bombs Ready Roundup

In missiles in 13 squadrons, most of them in launching pads below ground.

Along with the Atlas, this country plans 108 Titan missiles in 12 squadrons. Titans, too, are liquid fuel rockets designed to reach about 5,500 miles. They are somewhat bigger and are intended to mount a somewhat more powerful warhead than the Atlas.

The first Titan squadron is expected to be in place by this summer, at Lowry Air Force Base in Colorado.

The Atlases and Titans are essentially interim weapons. The mainstay ICBM of the future, for this country, will be the Minuteman. Present plans are pointed to more than 500 of these.

The Minuteman, which is due to become operational sometime next year, won't carry as big a punch as the Atlas and Titan. Its blast power will be on the order of 500, 900-600,000 tons of TNT.

But its range will be about 800 miles longer. And, most important, missilemen say its solld fuel makes it more reliable, quicker to fire and mediate 5-cent hourly wage in-
