





The general rule is that you
must furnish during the year over
half the support of every dependent you claim on your return. The only exception is for a dependent who can be claimed under a mul-

tiple support agreement.

In applying the support test you, must compare the amount you furnished towards the support of the dependent with the total cost of his support for the year.

The usual items included in cost of support are food, clothing, shelter, medical care, schooling, and similar necessities. If such frems are furnished in kind as, for example, a room in your house, you include the fair rental value of the room.

In addition to the items listed above, others may be included in determining whether such children's support. On the other hand, scholarship aids to children do not have to be taken into account in determining whether such children received over half their support from the parent. Free room, board, and tuition furnished by states to handicapped children are regarded by the Internal Revenue Service as scholarship aids.
