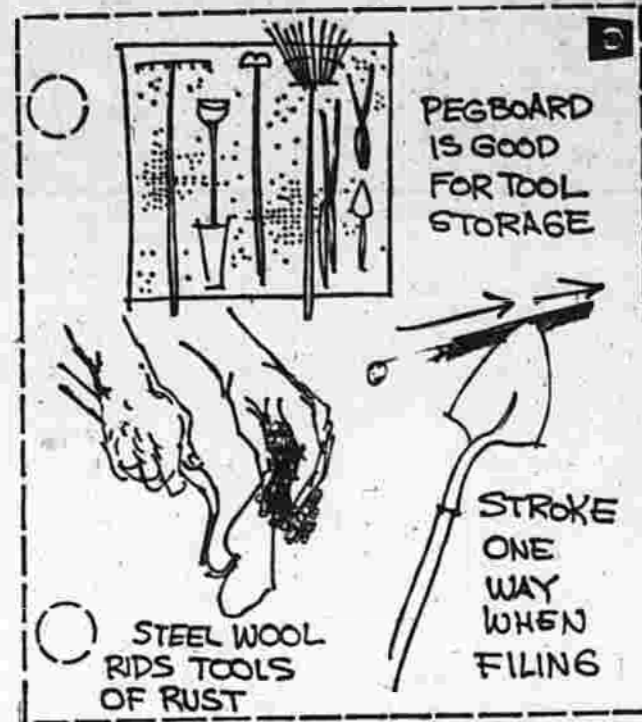

Home Gardener's Notebook

Get Tools in Shape Now for Spring

By ALLAN SWENSON (Written for NEA Service) Gardening with broken, blunt or rusted tools makes hard work of what should be fun. While you have the time this winter, tool up for easier gardening this spring.

Begin with an inventory of your garden equipment. Gather all your tools together and inspect them for needed repairs. Rust is as damaging to tools as fungus is to plants. A rusty shovel or hoe will pick up more dirt than a clean tool. Give rust removal first priority in tooling up. Clean tools also last longer.



On hoes, spades, axes and similar tools use a wire brush to remove rust. Dull tools double the effort you must use even for simple jobs. Once rust is gone, sharpening comes first.

Sharpening wooden tool handles with medium sandpaper will save your hands from splinters. After sanding, apply linseed oil to preserve unfinished wood. If you choose to paint handles, use a bright color. A distinctive color or pattern makes tools easier to spot, especially in the hands of children who are still using your borrowed tools.

Check fastenings on rakes, shovels and other implements. Replace screws and bolts. Replace a slightly split shaft. Use waterproof glue and rustproof screws or bolts. Sandpaper surfaces to prevent splinters or edges from cutting you or marring your clothes.

Inspect sprayers, dusters and other garden items, too. Rinse out sprayers, replace worn washers, nozzles and hoses. Look for chemical corrosion and clean it away or replace badly worn parts.

Examine your power mower and other equipment. A careful maintenance program will keep these tools performing at their peak of power this year.

Final step in tooling up is to locate all garden gear in one convenient place. Set up racks or hooks to hold the tools. With your tools repaired and ready, you'll be off to a running start when outdoor gardening begins.

Civil War mementoes, loaned by residents of Bolton, are on display this week at Bolton Public Library in connection with the observance of National Library Week.

The display of 18-year-old Nathan H. Geer, Company D, 2nd Connecticut Artillery, Tent 8, gives a graphic account of some of the Civil War battles which are also reported in an old book belonging to the library, "History of Connecticut during the Recent War, 1861-65."

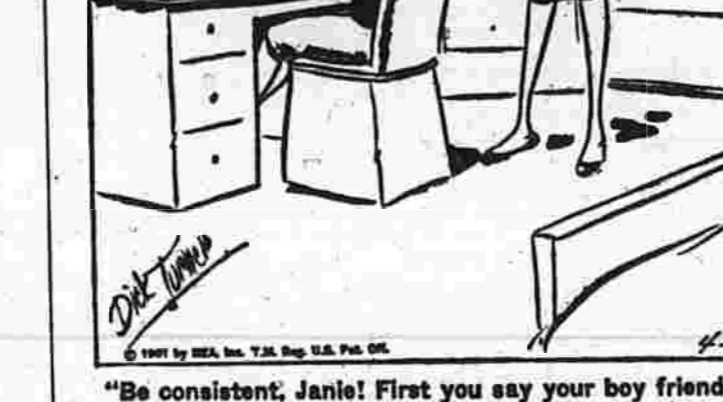

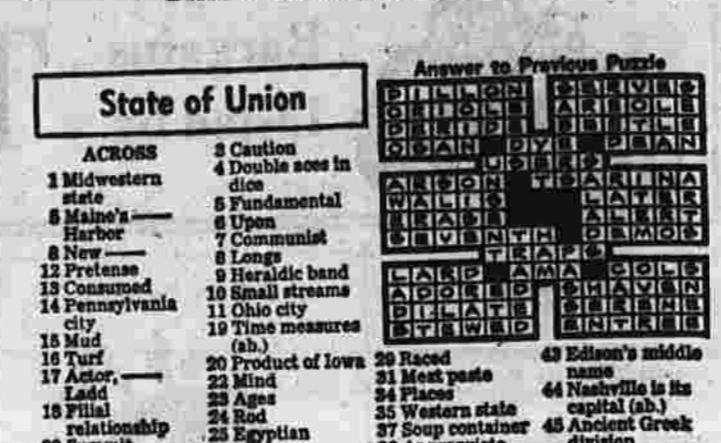

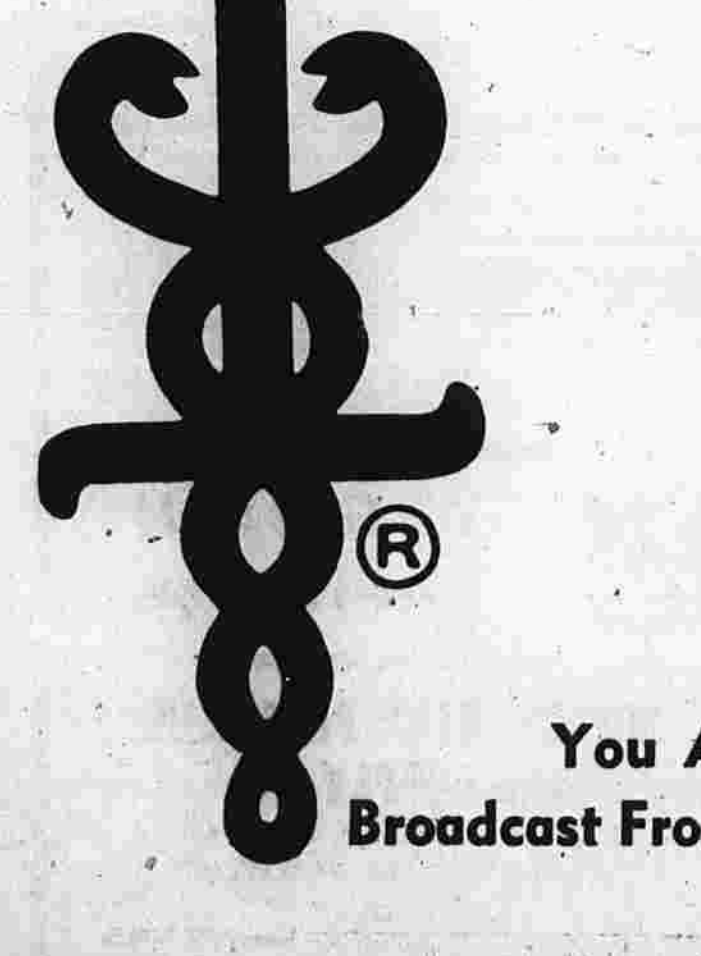
