

Home Gardener's Notebook

By ALLAN SWENSON (Written for NEA Service) Gardening with broken, blunt or rusted tools makes hard work of what should be fun. While you have the time this winter, tool up have the time this winter, tool up for easier gardening this spring.

Begin with an inventory of your garden equipment. Gather all your tools together and inspect them for needed repairs.

Rust is as damaging to tools as fungus is to plants. A rusty shovel or hoe will pick up much more dirt than a clean tool. Give

rust removal first priority in tooling up. Clean tools also last long-A coarse wire brush or steel wool will take off most heavy rust. Chemical rust removers also are handy and fast. Dull tools double the effort you must use even for simple jobs. Once rust is gone, sharpening On hoes, spades, shears and similar tools use a metal file. Stroke toward the cutting edge. Apply enough straight pressure cut, not slide. Avoid a back and forth motion.

To sharpen snips or clippers. clamp the tool firmly on a bench or in a vise. Stroke evenly along

the cutting edge, following the original blade bevel. Add finishing touches with a whetstone Replace badly damaged blades that have deep nicks or cuts. Sandpapering wooden tool han-dles with medium sandpaper will save your hands from splinters. After sanding, apply linseed oil to preserve unpainted wood. If you choose to paint handles, use a Methodist Choirs bright color. A distinctive color or patterns makes tools easier to spot especially in the hands of
