Shot with Astronaut Set for Next Week

Wallops Island, Va., April 28 (P)-The Mercury space capsule underwent its final and most severe unmanned test today with this verdict: A man aboard "unquestionably" could have survived

Next week an American astronaut at Cape Canaveral, Fla., vill stake his life on that finding. Little Joe VII, a cluster of six solid propellant rockets, leaped up from this test station of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration at 9:04 a.m. EST with the 3,000-pound space chamber on its nose.

Half an hour later, after a flight that produced stresses even more violent than the extreme conditions that had been planned, the capsule was back on the beach after a parachutecushioned landing in the sea and fast recovery by a helicopter. Meantime the vehicle had been blasted loose from the pooster by rocket devices intended to save a space flier in case of trouble in the liftoff.
